She completed her term as President of Burnaby Hospital's Thrift Shop in 1994 and is credited with promoting and significantly increasing sales in the Thrift Shop which allowed the Auxiliary to purchase much needed equipment for Burnaby Hospital. Donna still finds time to volunteer her service at the Thrift Shop on a regular basis.

Donna and her husband, Serg have resided in Burnaby since 1959 and raised their family (which now includes 6 grandchildren), spending countless volunteer hours with the Aubrey School P.T.A. and the Burnaby Mountain Scouts, Guides and Brownies. Donna also took an active role as a volunteer with the Burnaby Village Museum when it was first built. One of her favourite activities was to be the school marm, helping the many elementary school children envision what it would be like to be a student in Burnaby's early days. Although she is no longer an active volunteer, she continues to support the Museum through various donations of historical items.
