Ms. Marion McKenzie, Chairman of the Burnaby Branch of the Most Venerable Order of the Hospital of St. John of Jerusalem presented Mr. Sam Klassen, resident and employee of the City of Burnaby with the St. John Life Saving Award of Merit for his life saving efforts on September 12, 1995 when he went to the rescue of five young people who were involved in a car accident.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR EVANS: SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR JOHNSTON:

"THAT the delegations be heard."

- a) Mr. Arthur K. Quan, Chair of the Northwest Capitol Hill Resident Association, 301 North Hythe Avenue, Burnaby appeared before Council and referred to a recent report from the Director Planning and Building recommending redevelopment of the Capitol Hill water reservoir lands on North Hythe Avenue into 5 single family residential lots and that the adjacent Cambridge Street road allowance be retained and enhanced to serve as a public access view site. On behalf of the Capitol Hill Neighbourhood Association, Mr. Quan expressed opposition to the proposal to redevelop the Capitol Hill water reserve lands and introduced the following proposals:
 - 1. THAT Council promptly rehabilitate the reservoir and restore the lands for neighbourhood park use. Rehabilitation would allow for removal of the unsightly fencing, restoration of a maintained grass surface and the long awaited return of park benches.
 - 2. THAT Council take measures to enhance the attributes of the property by selectively thinning out the stand of scrub maple and alder trees and cleaning up the wild blackberry growth around the perimeter of the property. Further beautification initiatives could be added with planting of low growing ornamental trees and shrubs.
 - 3. THAT Council redesignate these lands from R2 residential district to park to preserve this area for future generations and to protect it from the temptations of future City Councils.

In concluding, Mr. Quan urged Council to reject the proposed redevelopment of the Capitol Hill water reservoir lands into residential lots and requested Council to allocate the necessary funds to rehabilitate and enhance the site in its entirety for neighbourhood park use and as a valued site where the general public has easy access to spectacular views.

Mr. Quan submitted a petition containing the signatures of 257 area residents which reads as follows:

"We, the undersigned, oppose the redevelopment into single family residential lots of the Capitol Hill water reservoir lands located on North Hythe Avenue. We wish these lands to be rehabilitated and enhanced for neighbourhood park use and to be restored and preserved as a valued site where the general public has easy access to the spectacular views. We urge Council to reject proposed redevelopment of these lands into residential lots and to allocate the necessary funds to rehabilitate and enhance these lands for park use. We further urge Council to redesignate these lands from R2 residential district to park."

Arising from the discussion, Councillor Drummond was given leave by Council to introduce the following motion:

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR DRUMMOND: SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR LAWSON:

"THAT staff develop a report in response to the concerns and proposals put forward by the delegation."

b) Mr. Arrigo Dalla Tina, 7321 Hastings Street, Burnaby appeared before Council regarding the realignment of the road connecting Burnaby Mountain Parkway to Hastings Street at the 7300 block. Mr. Dalla Tina stated his opposition to the proposed 60 ft. clearing to accommodate a right-of-way when only 20 ft. is required. Mr. Dalla Tina stressed that safety must be considered as a priority over any financial consideration. The speaker was of the opinion that the current design poses a safety hazard, particulary during inclement weather and therefore requested Council to take another look at the options available to them during the construction of the Hastings/Gaglardi Connector.

In concluding, Mr. Dalla Tina confirmed his support for the one-way road as is being proposed. Mr. Dalla Tina submitted a petition signed by 20 area residents which reads as follows:

"We, the undersigned, are fully supporting the alignment of the proposed connector from Hastings Street to Mountain Parkway to the existing Dalla Tina Avenue as presented by Mr. Arrigo Dalla Tina in the attached sketch."

Arising from the discussion, Councillor Evans was given leave by Council to introduce the following motion:

c) Ms. Parvin Chami, 3710 Kalyk Avenue, Burnaby appeared before Council to discuss the removal of trees in association with development of the Hong Kong Bank parking lot in Discovery Park's (BCIT) site. Ms. Chami advised that the area residents are upset regarding the changes to the buffer area and that it was their understanding that the buffer area would remain in its natural state and should not include grass or picnic areas.

The speaker concluded by requesting that in future, protected areas be clearly marked on plans, that changes be signed off by only one person, that the person responsible ensure that all persons involved sign an acknowledgement of all conditions attached to the protected areas, that the protected area be well signed and that there be a posting of a significant bond to protect trees.

Staff have requested a detailed replanting plan for this area which has been received and satisfactorily reviewed.

The Board will be requesting that the Government of British Columbia have the Fraser River as part of the Canadian Heritage River System.

Recognizing the shortcomings of the conventional approach, an integrated alternative consisting of storage facilities, infiltration trenches, biological and ecological processes has evolved to offer a balanced solution to the drainage control and environmental issues.

In concluding staff recommend that Council approve, in principle, the stormwater management alternative concept outlined in the report as the framework for urban run-off control in Burnaby and that staff be authorized to develop specific standards and design criteria for the design, construction, maintenance and monitoring of the components within the plan in consultation with the Ministry of Environment, Department of Fisheries and Oceans and the Greater Vancouver Regional District.

A rezoning bylaw is presently before Council to rezone the Norfolk area neighbourhood from the R3, R5 and R9 districts to the R12 district.

Staff report that if the development density were increased on this lot size to permit a gross floor area of 1400 sq.ft. per unit, the extra floor area would have to be located on the second floor of each unit. There would be no difference in size between the first and second floor and this would result in a more boxy design of the dwelling as illustrated in the report. This would also limit the design of units that use features such as bay windows, box windows or articulated facades.
