SUBJECT: REPLACEMENT OF RCMP EXISTING 9-1-1 SYSTEM

PURPOSE: TO SEEK COUNCIL APPROVAL TO EXPEND \$50,000 FOR THE REPLACEMENT OF THE RCMP'S PRESENT 9-1-1 EMERGENCY SYSTEM

RECOMMENDATION:


1. THAT Council authorize the expenditure of \$50,000 for the replacement of the RCMP's present 9-1-1 emergency system.

REPORT

In June of 1994 the RCMP Detachments and the GVRD were informed that the existing 9-1-1 system, which was out of date at the time of purchase, would no longer be serviced by B.C. Telephone. It was recommended that we replace our old system prior to the service agreement's expiration in July 1995. On the recommendation of Information Services, an agreement was made to purchase new 9-1-1 equipment. The cost of the equipment, labour and training was \$50,000.

Financing

Sufficient General Revenue Funds are available and the project is included under the 1995 RCMP component of the 1995-1999 Capital Program.
