MOVED BY COUNCILLOR RANKIN: SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR YOUNG:

"THAT the delegations be heard."

Councillor Corrigan returned to the Council Chamber at 7:11 p.m. and took his place at the Council table.

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

a) Mr. James Echino, owner, Ech-Tech Recycling Ltd., 5330 Byrne Road, appeared before Council to address concerns related to Ech-Tech Recycling's conformity to Burnaby bylaws.

Mr. Echino advised that Ech-Tech Recycling is a construction and demolition waste recycling operation. Mr. Echino advised that he has spent \$2.6 million to construct a 60,000 square foot building to house the operation. However, he has experienced serious construction delays including problems with soil, pile driving and cost overruns.

The speaker advised that he feels the project will be coming into conformity shortly and as a result he is requesting Council grant an additional four months for him to make application for an occupancy permit and come into conformity with municipal bylaws. Mr. Echino feels that if Council were to forestall legal action for four months, he could comply with all requirements.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR YOUNG: SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR DRUMMOND:

"THAT Item No. 08, City Manager's Report No. 14, 1995 March 20 be brought forward for consideration at this time."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

8. Ech-Tech Recycling Ltd. - 5350 Byrne Road

The City Manager submitted a report from the Director Finance outlining concerns with respect to Ech-Tech Recycling's lack of compliance with municipal regulations. Staff advise that Ech-Tech has had considerable opportunity to complete the building and to come into compliance with City bylaws. They have on several occasions provided development timetables and each occasion have failed to meet the deadlines they have established.

As a result, staff are requesting Council authorize legal action to demand compliance with City bylaws.

The City Manager recommended:

- 1. THAT Council authorize staff to take legal action against Ech-Tech Recycling Ltd. to:
 - a) stop the dumping of construction and demolition waste on 5350 Byrne Road.;
 - b) remove the pile of construction and demolition waste from 5350 Byrne Road;
 - c) remove the pile of construction and demolition waste from City property at 5722 and 5742 Marine Way.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR YOUNG: SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR DRUMMOND:

"THAT the recommendation of the City Manager be adopted."

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR RANKIN: SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR LAWSON:

"THAT Council postpone consideration of the staff report until the 1995 April 03 regular Council meeting."

CARRIED OPPOSED: COUNCILLORS CORRIGAN AND YOUNG

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR RANKIN: SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR LAWSON:

"THAT staff monitor activities at Ech-Tech Recycling to determine progress with respect to their attempts to stop the dumping of construction and demolition waste on 5350 Byrne Road; removal of the pile of construction and demolition waste from 5350 Byrne Road; and removal of construction and demolition waste from City property at 5722 and 4742 Marine Way."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

Arising from the discussion Councillor Corrigan was granted leave to introduce the following motion:

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR CORRIGAN: SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR YOUNG:

"THAT staff bring forward a report to the 1995 April 03 regular Council meeting providing a history of the efforts undertaken by staff to bring Ech-Tech Recycling into compliance with the municipal bylaws including information as to whether or not the business existed before the bylaw was adopted; the Council appearances that have occurred and the commitments made by the business; and an historical analysis of the efforts made by staff to achieve compliance."

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

b) Mr. Dan DeYoung, 1604 Springer Avenue, Burnaby, B.C. appeared before Council to address his application to rezone and subdivide his property into two 46¹/₂ foot lots.

The speaker submitted a petition signed by 42 neighbours, the text of which states as follows:

"I support an application to rezone and subdivide 1604 Springer Avenue into two 46.5 x 130 foot building lots."

Mr. DeYoung advised that by subdividing his property he would be able to construct two homes of about 2600 square feet each which would fit well within the character of the neighbourhood rather than an excessively large house which is permitted on the single lot, but would not fit within the character of the neighbourhood.

The speaker noted that the current structure is 50 years old and in deteriorating condition and therefore he is seeking Council's support to demolish the house and subdivide the site.

c) Mr. Joseph Traversa, 1330 Delta Avenue, Burnaby, B.C. appeared before Council to request Council approval to rezone and subdivide his property from R2 to R12 to allow construction of two medium sized houses rather than one large house. The R2 zone would allow construction of a 4800 square foot house which would be out of character with the balance of the neighbourhood.

Councillor Corrigan retired from the Council Chamber at 7:52 p.m.

As a result, the speaker is requesting Council allow his rezoning application to proceed and construct two smaller homes which would fit within the character of the neighbourhood.

b) Ngai Fung Chow, 1995 March 08, Re: 5221 Neville Street - Property classification and property tax

A letter dated 1995 March 08 was received from Ngai Fung Chow requesting Council change the classification for property at 5221 Neville Street from commercial to residential in order to reduce the property taxes.

A staff note advises that property classification for assessment is done exclusively by the B.C. Assessment Authority. The subject property is vacant and falls within the Community commercial District C2. For the Assessment Authority to consider residential classification, the property would have to be rezoned from Commercial to Residential. A previous attempt by the owner to rezone the property failed because rezoning from Commercial to Residential is inconsistent with the Community Plan for the area. Mr. Chow has been informed.

 c) Steve Mancinelli, 1995 March 29, Re: Nature Compensation and Mitigate for for Burnaby

A letter dated 1995 March 29 was received from Steve Mancinelli requesting people be given the opportunity to remove and save plants and trees from the area to be cleared for construction of the Hastings/Gaglardi Connector.

A staff notation appended to this item of correspondence advises that the suggestions advanced in the letter appear to have merit, although there are issues of access, safety and liability that would need to be addressed. The contract for the clearing of the Hastings/Gaglardi Connector has been let and is scheduled to commence by the end of March or the first week of April. Staff would suggest that this letter be forwarded to the Environment and Waste Management Committee for consideration of a policy position on this matter that potentially could apply in other public projects. d) Canada-British Columbia Partnership Agreement on Forest Resource Development: FRDA II, 1995 February 27, Re: Support for future federal-provincial agreement to replace the existing Forest <u>Resource Development Agreement (FRDA II)</u>

A memorandum dated 1995 March 01 was received from the F.C.M. requesting Council write to the Federal Minister of Environment requesting the federal government continue its involvement in the National Packaging Protocol.

A staff notation appended to this item of correspondence advises that endorsement of the F.C.M.'s request for NAPP support would be consistent with Council's past actions. Council have previously endorsed resolutions pertaining to excessive packaging and recycled material purchasing policies.

f) Doug Porter, 1995 March 06, Re: Quality of live broadcast of Council meetings

A letter dated 1995 March 06 was received from Doug Porter complaining about the termination of the Council broadcast on 1995 March 06 due to poor quality transmission. A letter in response to Mr. Porter's concerns has been received from the Roger's Community 4 Program Manager. Rogers advises that they are currently working to improve the link between City Hall and their head end facility in order to resolve their transmission problems. It is hoped that the new link will be operational by the end of May.

c) Environment and Waste Management Committee Re: Stride Avenue Landfill Closure Plan <u>Program - Phase I</u>

The Environment and Waste Management Committee submitted a report providing details of a phased closure plan for the Stride Avenue landfill and to request approval to proceed with the detailed engineering design for Phase I of the plan.

The closure plan is to be implemented in four phases; implementation of a gas management system, implementation of a leachate control system, implementation of an alternate yard waste disposal/collection system and implementation of a final landfill cover and revegetation program.

The Environment and Waste Management Committee recommended:

- 1. THAT Council endorse the four phase Stride Avenue landfill closure plan as outlined in the attached report.
- 2. THAT Council authorize staff to proceed with detailed engineering design for Phase I of the closure plan which includes the installation of a permanent landfill gas extraction system; and
- 3. THAT Council authorize staff to expend \$90,000 for the field investigation and engineering design services required for the landfill gas management phase of the closure program.

 - 1. Growth Strategies Act Draft Legislation

The City Manager submitted a report from the Director Planning and Building providing council with an overview of the Provincial government's Growth Strategies Act Draft Legislation and discussing its impact on the City of Burnaby.

The report expresses concerns with regard to the dispute resolution process outlined within the Act. It is felt that binding arbitration could erode Council's decision making power with respect to land use policy. As a result, staff suggest that the Act should be adjusted to allow municipal Councils to agree in principle with regional growth strategies rather than only having the option of either acceptance or rejection.

The City Manager recommended:

2. Broadway Connector: Cost Sharing

The City Manager submitted a report from the Director Planning and Building outlining a cost sharing approach with the Ministry of Transportation and Highways for completion of the Broadway Connector. The design concept previously approved by Council allows for a 12% grade including a bridge over the Stoney Creek Ravine. The Ministry views the inclusion of a bridge to be park development and as a result considers related costs to be the responsibility of the City.
