The Director Engineering has provided the following information:

"The Council policy for local improvement procedures was changed in 1994 from the initiative to the petition method. The first program undertaken by the petition method was last Fall's street lighting program where 14 of the 28 (50% returns) were endorsed by the property owners. The paving program outlined in this report is the second program governed by the petition process. The 14 successful petitions endorsed by the property owners represents a 70% return.

This 70% success rate is comparable with previous programs undertaken on the initiative method and, in fact, exceeds the 64% percentage approval received for the last paving program undertaken in 1993. The petition method requires active participation on the part of the property owners, in contrast to the passive approach inherent in the initiative method. The high success rate is indicative of the continued popularity of local improvement programs. Several of the streets in the proposed program date back to 1990 requests and it would appear that residents, in spite of a higher frontage charge (owners pay 50% of the cost of upgrading a basic 28ft residential street) and the current economic climate, are still eager to have these improvements.

The 1995 Capital Budget made allowance for an LIP paving program estimated at \$1 million. Based on the high rate of return, the successful petitions now total approximately \$2.3 million in construction costs. Further details will be provided at the time the Director Finance submits his cost report under Section 662 of the Municipal Act."
