- a) Mr. Ken Collier, President, Burnaby Mountain Senior Men's Golf Club, 4985 Grafton Street, Burnaby appeared before Council in response to the fee schedule contained in the proposed Burnaby Golf Fees Bylaw 1996 and, in particular, to the increases scheduled for seniors playing golf at the Burnaby Mountain Golf Course. The writer advised that a fee increase of 42% is proposed for 1996 for an annual pass and a further 42% for 1997. The speaker suggested that the current fee schedule at the Burnaby Mountain Golf Course provides a healthy profit at this time and submitted that the proposed increases are excessive and unnecessary. Such increases will preclude seniors from participating in the sport of golf which is an excellent form of recreation for seniors.

In concluding, Mr. Collier, on behalf of the Burnaby Mountain Senior Men's Golf Club requested Council give serious and compassionate consideration to the concerns expressed. Further, the speaker requested that, should Council refer this matter back to staff, that the Burnaby Mountain Senior Men's Golf Club be given an opportunity to have input in fee scheduling for 1996 and in future years.

1. Railway Taxation

The City Manager submitted a report from the Director Finance providing information on the impact of recent legislative changes on railway taxes in Burnaby. The Provincial Government feels railways need property tax relief to remain economically viable and competitive. They have developed enabling legislation and proposed a number of tax reform measures designed to reduce the property tax burden on railways, all of which have the potential to impact Burnaby taxpayers. Staff advised that Burnaby's concerns are that the imposition of restrictions would erode local government's authority to independently set tax

rates to recover the cost of providing service, that tax reductions for railways will result in a loss in general purposes taxes which will cause tax burden to shift to other tax payers in order to maintain current service levels and that rate restrictions intended to reduce rail taxes would actually have a minor impact on rail properties and provide tax abatement to mostly non-rail interests.

The City Manager recommended:

THAT the Mayor write to the Minister of Municipal Affairs, the Minister of Employment and Investment and the Minister of Finance and Corporate Relations to express strong opposition to the use of tax rate restrictions on Class 2 in general as a measure to reduce taxes on railway property in Burnaby; and

Councillor Evans was given leave by Council to introduce the following resolution regarding *National Medicare Week*:

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR EVANS:  
SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR JOHNSTON:

"THAT

WHEREAS our national public system of health care is of critical importance to the health and well-being of Canadians, including their standard of living; and

WHEREAS our health care system ensures that every single Canadian has access to affordable, quality health care on the basis of need of care alone, not on the basis of ability to pay; and

WHEREAS the public nature of this system has ensured this equal access for all; and

WHEREAS the vast majority of Canadians support the preservation of this system and oppose the notion of a two tier system based on the ability to pay; and

WHEREAS the vast majority of Canadians recognize Medicare as a defining symbol of what it means to be Canadian; and

WHEREAS recently passed federal budget legislation includes the Canada Health and Social Transfer (CHST) which is to be the new program through which federal funds for health care are funneled; and

WHEREAS the design of the CHST will end the federal cash transfers for Medicare over the next ten to twelve years leaving the federal government without the ability to enforce the national standards of universality, comprehensiveness, accessibility, portability, and public administration as detailed in the Canada Health Act; and

WHEREAS this will open the door to privatized health insurance for health care and destroy our public system; and

WHEREAS every industrialized country in the world except the United States has a public system of health care in which costs as a percentage of the economy are far lower than in the United States; now

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the City of Burnaby request that the federal government act to amend the Canada Health and Social Transfer to ensure there will always be a federal cash transfer for health care; and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED THAT the week of October 30th to November 3rd, 1995, be proclaimed as *Medicare Week* in the City of Burnaby."
