PURPOSE: TO PROVIDE THE COMMUNITY POLICING COMMITTEE WITH AN  
UPDATE ON THE PROCESS FOR SELECTING SIX CANDIDATES TO  
SERVE ON THE BURNABY HASTINGS HEIGHTS COMMUNITY  
POLICING NEIGHBOURHOOD CONSULTATION COMMITTEE.

RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT Community Policing Committee approve the appointment of six (6) volunteer applicants to serve on the Burnaby Hastings/Heights Neighbourhood Consultation Committee for a one year term.

R E P O R T

1.0 BACKGROUND

The first Townhall meeting for the Burnaby Hastings/Heights Neighbourhood area was held on 1995 May 16 at Gilmore Community School to introduce the Community Policing Committee of Council and to explain what Community Policing is and how it will affect the community if one resides or works within the boundaries of Burrard Inlet to Parker Street and Boundary Road to Willingdon Avenue. Information was provided on how citizens could become involved in Community Policing in their neighbourhood by volunteering to serve on a Consultation Committee.

The Community Policing Committee at its meeting held on 1995 June 07 requested that a sub committee be created consisting of Community Policing Committee members along with one RCMP representative. The sub committee's main objective would be to select volunteers for the Consultation Committee.

The sub committee met on three occasions, specifically 1995 July 27, August 02 and August 09 to interview the 22 volunteers who had submitted volunteer application forms at the Townhall meeting.

## 2.0 PURPOSE FOR CONSULTATION COMMITTEE

The purpose of the Consultation Committee is to provide a strong link to community police services, to assist in problem identification, resolution, planning and mobilizing community resources to solve problems at the roots, and to facilitate citizen participation by providing support and assistance in police decision making processes for service delivery. The Consultation Group will consist of twelve representatives from the community. Six organizations have been invited to participate on the Committee as follows:

The remaining positions will be filled by applicants from the Burnaby Heights neighbourhood at large. Duties of the Consultation Committee members will be to attend regular committee meetings, to participate in problem identification, and resolution, bring neighbourhood resources together to solve problems, and to serve on sub committees to assist in action plans where necessary.

## 3.0 CONCLUSION

The sub committee of the Community Policing Committee recommend six volunteers to serve on the Hastings Heights Community Policing Neighbourhood Consultation Committee. It is expected that the Committee members will serve for a one year term consisting of one meeting a month depending on issues at hand. A map is attached listing the areas in Burnaby represented on the Consultation Committee.

The sub committee of the Community Policing Committee is pleased to recommend the following names for volunteer representation on the Consultation Committee.
