60-21-110 Watermeters Renewal Program


Charge: 1995 Capital Budget
Water mains, pumping stations, etc \$50,000

Additional Information: Funds are required for the ongoing program of replacement of older Watermeters as a component of the automated meter reading system. The program will permit staff to maintain an accurate and efficient metering system to avoid the potential loss of revenue due to inaccurate meter readings. Sufficient General Revenue funds are available and these expenditures are included in the Water Utility component of the 1995 - 1999 Capital Program.

60-60-046 Emergency Power Generator - Justice Building

Charge: 1995 Capital Budget
City Buildings \$300,000

Additional Information: The Justice Building which currently houses the Provincial Court was constructed in 1966. An extension was added in 1980 to accommodate the RCMP detachment. Also, in the event of a major disaster, the building would be used as the coordinating centre for the City's Emergency Response Operations. At the present time a 30kW generator provides backup electrical power to the building. A recent study of the electrical power distribution within the RCMP section of the building identified the need to upgrade the existing generator so that in the event of a power outage an acceptable level of backup power would be available for the RCMP operational requirements as well as the City's emergency response functions. Sufficient general revenue funds are available and these expenditures are included in the City Buildings component of the 1995 - 1999 Capital Program.
