The delegation feels that he and his associates are being unfairly treated and would like Council to intervene to resolve their concerns in order to proceed with the greenhouse construction.

The City Manager submitted a report from the Director Planning and Building providing background information pertaining to a request from Mr. V. Hurtubise to appear as a delegation with respect to the construction of greenhouses at 8708 Royal Oak Avenue.

Staff advise that the Agricultural Land Commission have not approved the project because of concerns regarding the loading of fill at the site and the proposed layout of the greenhouses. However, the Agricultural Land Commission have advised Mr. Hurtubise that if he were to provide additional information detailing the required fill relative to the structural requirements of the proposed greenhouses; a professional layout plan indicating the location of the proposed greenhouses, road and other structures and a professional business plan for the proposed development, the A.L.C. would be willing to reconsider his application.

Mr. Bodner advised that Mr. Bernie Weinstein, National Manager, Cargoflo, CN Rail is also in attendance at the meeting to respond to questions of Council related to the operation of Cargoflo facilities.
