Councillor Redman arrived at the Council meeting at 7:05 p.m. and took her place at the Council table.

a) Ms. Deborah Wotherspoon, #34 - 5298 Oakmount Crescent, Burnaby appeared before Council to speak in favour of a 100% indoor environment smoke-free bylaw. The speaker advised the highest level of support for smoke free indoor environment exists in Burnaby and therefore requested Council take action similar to that taken by the City of Vancouver.

Councillor Rankin arrived at the Council meeting at 7:09 p.m. and took his place at the Council table.

Ms. Wotherspoon detailed health hazards associated with second hand smoke including throat infections, eye infections and respiratory problems. The speaker distributed literature to Council detailing problems associated with second hand smoke.

In concluding, Ms. Wotherspoon urged Council to put smoking restrictions through in Burnaby and also urged Council's support for programs to educate youth not to smoke.

Arising from the delegation, Councillor Drummond was given leave by Council to introduce the following motion:

"THAT staff prepare a report providing a comparison of actions taken by other municipalities bordering Burnaby, including a summary of actions taken by the GVRD municipalities and methods of enforcement contained in the bylaws."

b) Mr. Robert Isaac-Renton appeared before Council as the agent acting on behalf of the owners of the property located at 7659 - 14th Avenue who had submitted an application to rezone the property to permit subdivision into single family residential lots. Mr. Isaac-Renton expressed concern regarding the suggestion that a lane dedication will be required as a condition of the subsequent subdivision into residential lots. This requirement would present a serious financial hardship to the owners since only three single family lots could be realized instead of four.

The speaker further advised that a previous Council had evidently accepted the line of reasoning presented by the delegation and set a precedent for not requiring a lane at that

time. When the property was originally rezoned to P5, the Planning Department required a lane allowance but the owners appealed to Council who waved the requirement and that is why there IS no lane allowance on the property today.

The speaker concluded by respectfully requesting that Council proceed with the rezoning application without a requirement to provide the lane allowance.
