16th AVE AND 2nd STREET PEDESTRIAN CROSSING

**PURPOSE:** 

SUBJECT:

To respond to a request for the installation of a marked school crossing by school officials

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

1. THAT a marked school crossing be installed at the intersection of 16th Avenue and 2nd Street.

#### REPORT

Staff have been contacted by the Principal of Second Street Community School concerning the possibility of installing a school crossing at the intersection of 16th Ave and 2nd St. A study of the existing child pedestrian volume at the intersection was undertaken. The data collected confirms a high usage of the existing unmarked crossing at this intersection. This is a logical crossing location given entrance to the school grounds on the north east corner of this intersection for those residing to the west of 2nd Street withstanding proximity to the existing pedestrian signal at 16th Ave and 1st St. Our view is that the 1st Street pedestrian signal is a safer more appropriate crossing location. However, pragmatically we anticipate a continuing significant demand for crossing 16th at 2nd Street. To protect this crossing we concur with the principal's request for installation of a marked school crosswalk at this location. The school has agreed to having a crossing guard to provide the requisite supervision.
