SUBJECT: SCHOOL PLAYGROUND FUNDING REQUEST -

**SUBJECT: SCHOOL PLAYGROUND FUNDING REQUEST -
DOUGLAS ROAD SCHOOL AND SOUTH SLOPE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL**

RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT Council be requested to bring forward a Bylaw under Section 682(2) of the Municipal Act to enter into an agreement with the Burnaby School Board for contributions to the cost of playground development in the amount of \$6,000 as detailed in this report.

REPORT

Appearing under Correspondence on this Agenda is a letter from Bernice Taylor of the Parent Advisory Council, South Slope Elementary School. In her correspondence Ms. Taylor is requesting a grant of \$3,000 from the Parks & Recreation Commission for Phase 2 of the Playground Development Project. Outlined in the letter is that the Playground Committee did not receive funding for Phase 1 as they had sufficient funding in place.

At its meeting of 1996 February 07, the Commission received a request from Mrs. Yvonne Lukas of the Douglas Road Playground Committee for a grant of \$3,000 for their project.

Both project meet the criteria approved by the Commission with respect to playground grants. The School Board has identified the installation of these projects in their 1996 work plan.

These projects will not only enhance the play features of the school population, but will provide a much needed service in the respective communities.
