Mr. Helden further suggested that buses are needed at the Vancouver International Airport on a 24 hour basis in order to accommodate those passengers arriving in Vancouver after midnight.
- b) **Mr. Victor Stusiak,** Apac Services Inc., 8338 Hollis Place, Burnaby, B.C. appeared before Council on behalf of Mr. Bulic, the applicant for subdivision of the property at 4541 Grafton Street. Mr. Stusiak read from a prepared brief, a copy of which is available in the City Clerk's office.

The primary issues addressed in Mr. Stusiak's presentation were the requirement of dedication and development of a lane and parkland development charges; all of which, the speaker indicated, are City requirements supplemental to actual subdivision of the lot.

In concluding his presentation, Mr. Stusiak requested Council obtain a legal opinion, in report form, from the City Solicitor relating to the application of a park levy to the subject subdivision; a legal opinion, in report form, as to the Council authority to require the development to provide servicing of the lane; and finally, that Council survey the property owners in the immediate block to determine their response for the need for the subject lane.
