CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

a) Mr. Ken Soderman, residing at 8100 Lucerne Road, Richmond appeared before Council as the owner/operator of Winchesters Steak House at 6743 Kingsway to discuss the smoking ban and its effects on his business. Mr. Soderman advised that he has been a Burnaby resident for forty years and has owned and operated restaurants in the City since 1977. The speaker advised Council that his concern was not over the issue of smoking but rather of fairness to restaurant owners. The speaker contended that the smoking bylaw requires serious evaluation in order to create a level playing field and to provide all parties involved a suitable time to adapt to this change in lifestyle.

In concluding his comments, Mr. Soderman suggested that the Burnaby Smoking Bylaw will not stop people from smoking but rather stop the smokers from going to Burnaby restaurants. In terms of a compromise, Mr. Soderman offered the following alternatives to the Burnaby Smoking Bylaw:

- 1. Create a new business licence category.
- 2. Give restaurant owners approval to apply for an "A" licence.
- 3. Allow restriction access to children.
- 4. Allow smoking after 7 p.m.
- 5. Introduce grandfather rights to existing operations.
- 6. Proper ventilation and air cleaning systems that could be metered by the Health Department.
- 7. Allow for the posting of signs, warning that there is smoking on the premises and allow customers to make their own decision.
- 8. Allow a phase-in period until the Year 2001 and then permit metered smoking rooms enclosed ventilated.
- 9. Introduce a referendum to all Burnaby residents, paid for in part by all the restaurants and pubs.

Mr. Bing Smith, residing at 8388 McGregor Avenue, Burnaby appeared before Council to respond to an inquiry regarding the situation being experienced in the City of Coquitlam where smoking is permitted in restaurants. Mr. Smith advised that the Coquitlam restaurants are currently looking at solutions as they feel they have an unfair advantage over Burnaby restaurants. Mr. Smith further advised that representatives from fifty to sixty Burnaby restaurants were in attendance at the Council meeting this evening.

Mr. Ken Soderman provided the City Clerk with a petition containing 717 signatures from patrons of Burnaby restaurants, the content of which reads as follows:

"We the undersigned, as customers of _____ are opposed to the current bylaw which prohibits smoking in Burnaby restaurants.

We feel that this bylaw is unfair to restaurants and should be eliminated."

b) Mr. Gary Gibson, #243 - 4609 Kingsway, Burnaby appeared before Council to request that the zoning bylaw that specifies that dog training centres must be restricted to agricultural land be amended. Mr. Gibson advised that he and his wife founded and operated the canine corrections program at the Burnaby Corrections Centre for Women for the past eight years. The focus of this program was to build skills, confidence and a sense of responsibility in female inmates (and the dogs too). This was done through their learning the skills necessary to care for the dogs - training, modifying behaviour, grooming, feeding and maintaining the kennels.

The speaker advised that, since the closing of the Canine Corrections Program in October 1996, he has been planning a training centre that would embody the concept and standards maintained in the prison program. The vision for the training centre encompasses many areas and will be a place where dog owners can come to train, resolve problems, educate themselves and play with and teach their dogs. Owners will learn how to achieve and maintain a happy, problem free and lasting relationship. The centre will also continue the tradition of offering free education to veterinarians, the SPCA staff, rescue groups and novice dog trainers.

Mr. Gibson proposed that the centre would be opened from 1 p.m. to 9 p.m., five days a week with most people and dogs visiting after 6 p.m. and spending thirty to sixty minutes each on the premises. There will be no dogs kept overnight at the facility at any time. As well, Mr. Gibson advised of his plans to conduct regular seminars led by professionals in the canine field and that arrangements are presently being made to have prisoners and parolees work and apprentice via citizen escort and day passes.

In concluding his comments, Mr. Gibson noted that other municipalities have adopted liberal policies in this area and modified their bylaws to accommodate a training centre. The City of Vancouver allows training centres in five zones and will look at eight other

zones and the City of Richmond can accommodate such a business in four zones. Because Burnaby's present bylaw doesn't leave any room for interpretation, Mr. Gibson requested Council to give serious consideration to his request.

Arising from consideration of the presentation, Councillor Evans was given leave by Council to introduce the following motion:

A letter was received from the B.C. Gaming Commission advising of a relocation application from Gateway Casinos to relocate from Haney, B.C. to the Clarion Hotel at 4331 Dominion Street in Burnaby. Consistent with its policy on relocations, the Gaming Commission is notifying Burnaby to provide an opportunity for the identification of any concerns regarding the proposed relocation. The Gaming Commission also requests any comments or concerns of the local RCMP.

A staff note advises that Council gave final adoption to Rezoning Reference No. 24/96 on 1997 May 05 in order to permit the establishment of the casino. It is recommended that Council reaffirm its support for the intended use of the existing parking structure/office facility for a casino.

RCMP have indicated that they have some concerns which could be mitigated by preventative measures. The operators will be advised to discuss these concerns with the RCMP prior to commencing operation.

c) Norma Hillmer, 1997 April 22
Re: Use of barbecues on balconies
of apartment buildings without sprinklers

A letter was received from Norma Hillmer expressing her concern regarding the use of barbeques on balconies of apartment buildings which are not equipped with sprinklers.

A staff note advises that the Burnaby Fire Department has no policy that permits gas barbeques on balconies of apartment buildings. The B.C. Fire Code also has nothing to say on this particular matter. It is at the discretion of the building's owner, agent or manager to decide if any kind of barbeque will be permitted on their balconies.

Staff further advise that there are some restrictions regarding propane barbeques on balconies. These refer to how propane cylinders are to be transported inside a building and certain distances that a cylinder and the barbeque must be from an opening in the building, air intakes and source of ignition such as electrical outlets and switches. Staff have contacted Mrs. Hillmer and discussed this matter with her.
