SUBJECT: 1997/98 COMMUNITY SCHOOL GRANT

RECOMMENDATIONS:

- THAT the expenditure of \$261,327 as the City's share of the funds for six Community Schools be approved.
- 2. THAT Council be requested to authorize a bylaw to be drawn up to enter into an agreement with the Burnaby School Board for the support and operation of six Community Schools.

REPORT

At its meeting of 1997 January 09, the District Community School Advisory and Coordinating Committee approved the 1997/98 Community School budget, and that the School District and the City of Burnaby be requested to provide the funds for the operation of Community Schools during the 1997/98 school year. Attached is a letter from the School District outlining the operating budget and the source of funding.

It is noted that this year's request is the same as 1995 and 1996. Maywood School is being funded on a short-term basis from a Provincial grant. Consideration for extending funds for Maywood School in the 1998/99 school year budget will be given at a future meeting.

Funds are identified in the City's Annual Operating Budget.

A bylaw is required to enter into an agreement with the Burnaby School Board as per section 682 of the Municipal Act.

The school board at its meeting of 1997-04-22 included \$261,327 in the school district's 1997/98 operating budget to support community schools.

For your information, the \$261,327 is for the operation of six community schools and does not include funding for Maywood (see attached letters). The school district is operating Maywood as a partial community school with interim funding from a provincial grant. It should be noted that the amount requested from the school district and city has not increased since 1995.

Please consider this letter as the formal request to include in the city's operating budget the sum of \$261,327 as its share of the funds required to support Burnaby's Community School Program



1997/98 Community School Operating Budget Information

- 1. The cost per community school is \$99,362.
- 2. The community school budget operates as a trust account with any surplus/deficits carried forward.
- 3. The 1997/98 budget expends a \$4,364 surplus carried forward from the 1995/96 budget year.
- 4. The 1997/98 budget also utilizes a \$69,152 community school operations grant from the Ministry of Education.
- 5. The community school budget merges the school district (school year July 01 June 30) with the city (calendar year Jan. 01 Dec. 31) to produce an 18-month budget cycle with a one-year "leap frog" factor for any surplus/deficit.
