An application was received from the Odyssey of the Mind team at Burnaby North Secondary School requesting a grant towards the cost of sending the team to the World Competition at the University of Maryland from 1997 June 04 to 07. The estimated cost of the trip to \$10,000.

Odyssey of the Mind is an international program for kids of all ages that challenges each participating team to solve problems with creativity and logic. The team solves problems entirely on its own without assistance from parents, teachers or coaches. Most importantly, the team learns to work together.
