b) Ronald W. Bates, 1998 August 05 Re: Lakefield Bike Path Implications Speaker: Ronald Bates

Mr. Ronald Bates, 5850 Baffin Place, Burnaby appeared before Council accompanied by Karen Wristen, Senior Counsel and John Werring, Staff Scientist, both from the Sierra Legal Defense Fund. Mr. Bates indicated that his purpose for appearing before Council was to discuss matters pertaining to process regarding the proposed Lakefield Bike Path.

Mr. John Werring, Staff Scientist for Sierra Legal Defense Fund advised that traps had been set in the stream in order to identify the types of fish habitat and, at 2 p.m. today he reported finding cutthroat trout. The fish traps were set in compliance with a permit from the Department of Fisheries and Oceans and as a result of the testing, Mr. Werring estimated that the whole package of streams in the immediate area constitutes an important source of nutrients for the fish habitat found in the stream.

Ms. Karen Wristen, Senior Counsel for Sierra Legal Defense Fund addressed Council advising that permission will be required from the Department of Fisheries and Oceans in order to construct the proposed Lakefield Bike Path. Ms. Wristen further noted that Council's record on environmental issues has not gone unnoticed and commended Council for their good track record.

Mr. Ronald Bates addressed Council and commended local residents and Council for the time that has been taken to discuss and review all issues pertaining to the preservation of Lubbock's Woods and the streams. Mr. Bates requested that Council attempt to address the conflicts, work together with the local residents and seek a compromise acceptable to both parties. Mr. Bates noted that the area residents do indeed recognize the need for a bike route and that the proposal is not being challenged. However, the residents feel that there must be a compromise in terms of the size of the footprint path that will travel through Lubbock's Woods.

Mr. Harry Karmitsa, 5841 Bayview Circle appeared before Council and enquired if there has been an evaluation of the environment and upstream habitat in Lubbock's Woods to determine whether or not there are any other barriers or impediments to fish. Mr. Karmitsa suggested that this type of assessment would take a considerable amount of time and requested that Council withhold any decision or project on the Lakefield Bike Path project until such time as the assessment has been completed.

5. BURNABY SMOKING REGULATION BYLAW 1996

The City Manager submitted a report from the City Solicitor updating Council on recent legislation affecting the Burnaby Smoking Regulation Bylaw. Staff advised that on July 30, 1998 Royal Assent was given to Bill 50, Miscellaneous Statutes Amendment Act No. 3, 1998. This Act amends both the Municipal Act and the Municipalities Enabling and Validating Act No. 2 on matters relating to the regulation by Municipalities of smoking tobacco. The effect of the legislation is not only to give Municipalities the power to enact prohibitory smoking bylaws but, in the case of the City of Burnaby, to retroactively validate the Burnaby Smoking Regulation Bylaw and legislatively overrule the Provincial Court judgement that declared it invalid.

The report concludes by advising that the proposed height measurement method addresses the C2 properties which have steep slopes and would permit heights of two storeys at the front of a building on the steepest sloping C2 district properties, only three of which have been identified. The proposed amendment will ensure that buildings constructed on steep slopes do not exceed three storeys, particularly at the rear of the building, which will ensure that C2 buildings do not dominate adjacent residential neighbourhoods.

7. Byrne Creek - Fish Kill on 1998 July 26

The City Manager submitted a report from the Director Engineering providing information regarding the recent fish kill in Byrne Creek and seeking approval of the proposed Community meeting with the Byrne Creek Watershed residents on Wednesday, 1998 August 19.

Staff advised that the illegal discharge of a toxic substance into Byrne Creek on July 25 has created a detrimental effect on the fish population in the Creek and destroyed much hard work done by Community volunteers over the years. Staff, in consultation with Burnaby Streamkeepers and the Vancouver Angling and Game Association are proposing two events - Community Meeting and Special Fish Release to be held on August 19 and September 27, respectively. Both events would provide an excellent opportunity to invite the public to participate in the overall effort of preserving and protecting Burnaby's urban streams.

B.C. Transportation Financing Authority (BCTFA)
 High Occupancy Vehicle Program: Willingdon

The City Manager submitted a report from the Director Planning and requesting Council approval to cost-share with the B.C. Transportation Financing Authority (BCTFA), a planning study of the Willingdon HOV/Bus Lane Project. Staff advised that Council transportation policy, as embodied in the Burnaby Transportation Plan, supports the concept of HOV facilities. With regard to specific projects, the development of the Willingdon transportation corridor between Metrotown, Brentwood, the Hastings Street commercial area (and possibly further north to a future WCE station) as a major transit corridor and urban trail facility is a necessary component of the City's plans to link the growing town centres in Burnaby with high capacity transit service and improved bicycle/pedestrian facilities. Although the BCTFA has not responded positively to Burnaby's request to cover 100% of the estimated \$50,000.00 cost of the planning studies, it is recommended that Council consider funding 50% of the studies based on the rationale that Willingdon is currently a municipal road that is not part of the main

road network and thus not eligible for GVTA funding. From this perspective, the opportunity to receive 50% cost-sharing for the necessary planning studies to advance this HOV project to a point where it could be implemented in 1999 with greater funding from the BCTFA and GVTA, can be considered a worthwhile and cost-effective expenditure of City funds for an environmentally sound transportation future for Burnaby.

The City Manager recommended:

- 1. **THAT** a Capital Reserves Expenditure Bylaw in the amount of \$50,000 (inclusive of 7% GST) be brought down to finance the planning study for the Willingdon HOV/bus lane.
- 2. **THAT** copies of this report be forwarded to L. Holowachuck, Director, Highway Planning, BCTFA, W. Lambert, Director, Transportation Planning, BC Transit and D. Harvey, Director, Campus Development, BCIT.

11. Recreational Cycling in Parks

The City Manager submitted a report from the Director Parks, Recreation and Cultural Services requesting authority for an amendment of the Burnaby Parks Regulation Bylaw 1979 to allow cycling in all parks, to require cyclists to wear safety helmets, to authorize the City Solicitor to prepare a Parks Bicycle Bylaw and to forward a copy of this report to the Bicycle Committee.

The report concludes by advising that allowing cycling on trails and pathways in all parks is a positive, proactive policy that responds to the increased popularity and demand for recreational cycling opportunities. In allowing cycling on trails and pathways in all parks, children and youth would be permitted to cycle in a safe environment, and access to facilities by bicycle through parks would be allowed. Staff indicate that this policy legitimizes the way that the public is currently using the park system. It is anticipated that there will not be a significant increase in use, and that permitting cycling in parks will be compatible with other uses. A progressive implementation program is proposed to help phase in the proposal.

The City Manager recommended:

- THAT Council authorize an amendment of the Burnaby Parks Regulation Bylaw 1979, Section 44, to delete the words "or bicycle", to allow cycling in all parks.
- 2. **THAT** the City Solicitor be authorized to prepare a Parks Bicycle Bylaw which will allow cycling in all parks except: off the trails and pathways, or where prohibited by signage.
- 3. **THAT** the Parks Bicycle Bylaw require that cyclists wear safety helmets while cycling in all areas under jurisdiction of the Parks and Recreation Commission, subject to a \$25 fine, with fines of \$75 for other Bylaw infractions.

In the event that existing improvements on the site are vacant and considered to be unsafe, unstable, and a hazard to life, the Fire Prevention Division may recommend immediate demolition of such improvements and removal of the resultant debris prior to Third Reading.
 - e) The dedication of any rights-of-way deemed requisite.
 - f) The deposit of the applicable GVS&DD sewerage charge.

g) The provision of facilities for cyclists.
