Superintendent Ron Dicks introduced Constable Mike Merritt, Constable Pat Clark and Mr. Wayne Quistberg and presented to each of them the *Commanding Officer Commendation Award* for acts of bravery regarding an armed robbery which took place on June 4, 1994 at the Zellers Store in Metrotown. a) Mr. Robert Turecki, Robert Turecki Architect, 5615 Dunbar Street, Vancouver appeared before Council to discuss the preliminary plan approval application for 7301 Kingsway/7305 Edmonds Street. Mr. Turecki provided background information on the project which entails a ten story building with 172 hotel rooms as well as office, retail, entertainment and restaurant space. Mr. Turecki indicated that the proposed future road widening for the intersection of Kingsway and Edmonds has been discussed with staff in terms of a solution and/or compromise. Being as the site is very short in depth, difficulties are created in terms of providing the necessary setbacks from the existing Kingsway and Edmonds Street right-of-way lines. As a result, relaxations will be required in order to make the project viable.

In concluding his comments, Mr. Turecki requested Council's support for the proposed development in order to see the project move forward as soon as possible.

b) Ms. Amy Newman, 4806 Canada Way appeared before Council advising she was the school crossing guard for Douglas Road Elementary School. Ms. Newman indicated that her purpose for appearing as a delegation was to urge Council to work with the Provincial government to provide funding in order to maintain Burnaby's School Crossing Guard Program. Ms. Newman advised that her ultimate concern is the safety of school children getting to and from school, particularly when they must travel across major roadways such as Canada Way, Hastings Street, etc. during the 3 p.m. rush hour period.

In concluding her comments, Ms. Newman invited Council to visit the major intersections where crossing guards are deployed for the purpose of witnessing the hazardous situations that school children are faced with each day. Ms. Newman further requested that the City work together with the Department of Highways toward achieving interim funding for the Burnaby School Crossing Guard Program.

Ms. Leslie Kurtz, 4361 Gatensby Street, Burnaby appeared before Council advising she was a school crossing guard at Canada Way and Burris. Ms. Kurtz stressed that school crossing guards also provide a safe haven for school children who are distressed and they also assist seniors and physically challenged people who are attempting to cross busy intersections such as Canada Way and Burris. The speaker advised that school children are faced with dangerous situations everyday as they travel to and from school and that is the reason that the crossing guard program is so essential. Ms. Kurtz

suggested that if the crossing guard program is not maintained it is inevitable that an accident involving a child will occur.

In closing, Ms. Kurtz expressed her opinion that the City of Burnaby and the Province are in a position of responsibility in terms of the safety of school children and urged Council to take appropriate measures to provide funding to maintain the school crossing guard program.

Arising from consideration of the presentation from Ms. Newman and Ms. Kurtz, Councillor Evans was given leave by Council to introduce the following motion:

Mr. Smith indicated his pleasure that, as a result of the recent court ruling with respect to the Burnaby Smoking Bylaw, restaurants now have the option of providing smoking to their patrons which results in fairer competition with restaurants in outlying municipalities. Mr. Smith concluding by suggesting that Council not pursue an appeal of the Provincial court decision regarding the Burnaby Smoking Bylaw and invited Council to work together with the Restaurant and Food Services Association to resolve the issues.

Mr. Geoffrey Howes, Director of the British Columbia Restaurant and Food Services Association appeared before Council requesting that Council not pursue an appeal of the recent Provincial court ruling regarding Burnaby's Smoking Bylaw but rather, await the implementation of the Worker's Compensation Board regulations on January 01, 2000. Mr. Howes urged Council to keep this matter as low key as possible until such time as the Provincial regulations come into effect which would create a level playing field for all restaurants across the province.
