- a) **Mr. Jim Schuman**, President of Coast Marksmen and residing in Deep Cove appeared before Council on behalf of Burnaby Fish and Game Club, Coast Marksmen and the Barnet Rifle Club. The purpose of appearing before Council was to present a joint target club position with respect to the target ranges located on the north slope of Burnaby Mountain.

Mr. Schuman opened his presentation by requesting Council to table the recommendations contained in the report appearing before them this evening until such time as the Burnaby Mountain Master Plan is completed and that the gun clubs maintain their stakeholder status through the process.

*Councillor Johnston arrived at the Council meeting at 7:07 p.m. and took his place at the Council table.*

The speaker then proceeded to address issues set out in a prepared brief, a copy of which is available in the City Clerk's Office. The issues included the covenant on the property, noise, salmon enhancement, environmental concerns, indoor ranges and alternate facilities.

*Councillor Redman arrived at the Council meeting at 7:14 p.m. and took her place at the Council table.*

Mr. Schuman referred to the Master Plan process which states that full public input will be key to the success. In an effort to provide full public input, the three gun clubs commissioned a poll to ask the Burnaby public their views about the ranges. As a result of the survey, Mr. Schuman reported that the great majority of Burnaby public seemed to be quite content that the ranges remain within the park.

In concluding his comments, Mr. Schuman cautioned Council that supporting the staff recommendations before them would be a devastating irreversible decision and predicted that the three gun clubs would fold as a result.

Mr. Schuman urged Council to support a six month delay and allow the stakeholders to participate in the master plan process. Mr. Schuman suggested that this delay would be at no cost to the taxpayers and would provide an opportunity for an extensive, detailed and thorough process.

1. Burnaby Mountain Outdoor Target Ranges

The City Manager submitted a report from the Director Parks, Recreation and Cultural Services providing additional information with respect to the issues raised by the gun clubs who appeared as a delegation at the regular Council meeting held on 1997 November 17.

The report advises that the evidence from the consultant’s study clearly shows the three properties in question as being contaminated with residual metals from many years of outdoor target shooting which forces staff to recommend that this activity cease as soon as possible and that both the short term and long term remediation plan be developed and implemented. Staff advised that they will continue to work with representatives of the clubs to find alternative sites for the recreation sport and the Manager’s Office will continue working with the Attorney General, Police Services Special Committee for development of a Force Options Training Centre including an indoor firearms range. The report further advises that construction of an indoor facility on the Burnaby Mountain site does not fit within the restrictive covenant and environment services staff indicate that the contaminated soil conditions would make the site a costly option as full remediation would be required.

Staff indicated that the future use of the site has to consider the impacts of the contaminated soil and the need for remediation plans. These issues will be considered as part of the Burnaby Mountain Management Plan process and will be covered in a future report to the Parks and Recreation Commission, appropriate Committees and Council.

The City Manager recommended:

1. THAT the results of the Envirochem study be shared with representatives of the three gun clubs, and that their cooperation be requested in the process of relocating outdoor shooting to the Burnaby Fish and Game Club site as soon as possible.
2. THAT outdoor shooting be permitted at the Burnaby Fish and Game Club until 1998 June 30, on the condition that members from the Barnet Rifle Club and Coast Marksmen Inc. be permitted to use the facility.
3. THAT the Burnaby Fish and Game Club and Coast Marksmen Inc. be permitted to operate their respective indoor ranges until 1998 September 30 on the condition that members of the Barnet Rifle Club be given access to the indoor ranges.
4. THAT the Barnet Rifle Range, Burnaby Fish and Game Club and Coast Marksmen Inc. be given notice to remove all furnishings and fixtures and vacate the properties at 8252, 8530 and 8550 Barnet Highway by 1998 October 31.
5. THAT a remediation plan to mitigate the offsite migration of leachate materials be developed and submitted to the Ministry of Environment and that work begin as soon as possible.
6. THAT a long term remediation plan which addresses the contaminated soils be developed for the three properties.
7. THAT staff work with the three Gun Clubs to seek alternatives for a new indoor range facility location for their recreational sport which meets all current and proposed Municipal, Provincial and Federal regulations.
8. THAT staff work with the Burnaby RCMP to ensure suitable arrangements are in place to facilitate its members to complete their annual firearms certification.

9. THAT staff continue to work with the Ministry of Attorney General, Police Services Special Committee for the development of a Force Options Training Facility which meets all current and proposed Municipal, Provincial and Federal regulations.
