In 1998 the Centre assisted over 1500 individuals to find suitable volunteer opportunities and helped 300 community organizations recruit and keep volunteers. In 1999 the Centre's main objective is to become a primary centre of excellence by working in partnerships with member agencies to increase awareness of volunteer opportunities in Burnaby, by increasing use of Internet technologies to improve volunteer access to information and resources, by providing support to new Canadian, senior and special needs volunteers and by assisting special needs individuals through the Special Needs Access Program.
