An application was received from Global Vision requesting funding assistance for Alison Fung to participate in the Junior Team Canada Trade Mission to the Philippines and Thailand this summer.

Global Vision is a non-profit organization founded in 1991 by business, government and education leaders. The goal of the Junior Team Canada program is to present youth with the opportunity to learn about Canada's role in the global market place and how to make Canada more competitive internationally.

Global Vision has training centres across Canada sponsored by the Export Development Corporation. Youth take part in activities such as networking sessions with prominent business people in the community and case study presentations. At the end of the training centre, participants are invited to compete for a spot on the Junior Team Canada Program. Ms. Alison Fung, a successful applicant, is a Burnaby resident who plans to attend SFU this fall. Being part of the program will provide her with valuable life skills and give international exposure to her sponsors.
