WHEREAS the City has in the past been successful in achieving significant space and facility contributions in conjunction with new major mixed use development initiatives, particularly within Burnaby's town centres, that have provided public benefits in various forms including meeting rooms, information kiosks, child care facilities, community-use space for non-profit organizations, and community police station space but to date have not included cultural facilities, and

WHEREAS there may be an opportunity to utilize a variety of potential mechanisms to acquire space and/or facilities in such new developments in the future, including voluntary contribution, application of Burnaby's community amenity density bonusing provisions, or potentially private or corporate donations in accordance with provisions made available in conjunction with Revenue Canada, and

WHEREAS there is a manifest interest in creating additional and new opportunities for further public access to the visual and performing arts at locations that are easily accessible to the widest possible range of Burnaby families and persons working in Burnaby, and

WHEREAS the Metrotown area is not only Burnaby's primary town centre, easily accessible by SkyTrain and public transit, but is also a regional town centre and a major tourist destination, and

WHEREAS the accomplishment of significant spaces and facilities for public use in new developments is expected to be necessarily complex and a substantial undertaking in terms of the magnitude of the spaces and values involved, beyond the scope of Burnaby's experience to date,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT staff be requested to examine and report back to Council on the feasibility and desirability of acquiring space in future major mixed-use developments in the Metrotown Town Centre to provide facilities for the City's use to accommodate the visual and/or performing arts, including an analysis of the mechanisms that are practicably available for sécuring such, including voluntary contribution, density bonusing, and private or corporate donation within the regulations applied by Revenue Canada."

Councillor Der:

Councillor Der was granted leave by Council to introduce the following Notice of Motion for consideration at the 'Open' Council meeting on 2000 January 17:

"THAT

WHEREAS Provincial gaming (casino) income has been intended to be used for Provincial government, casino owners and charities, non-profit and other community groups, and

WHEREAS Provincial gaming funds now include municipalities, and

WHEREAS the municipal share of these funds is 10% of net proceeds from casinos within their boundaries and Burnaby's anticipated share for the year 2000 is estimated at a minimum of \$2.8 to 4 million, and

WHEREAS there is no guarantee that these funds will continue to be allocate to charities, non-profit, and other groups and municipalities in future years, and

WHEREAS the gaming funds are not included in the operating budget,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- Burnaby City Council allocate one million dollars of the Provincial gaming funds from the first quarter to a charities, non-profit and other community groups non-statutory reserve fund where only the interest could be used each year, and
 - 2. These funds be in addition to the current donations and grants budget and,
 - 3. Staff be asked to formulate terms of reference for approval by Council on the yearly allocation of funds so that the monies would be used in the most efficient and effective way."

Councillor Redman:

Councillor Redman introduced discussion of the proposed gypsy moth spray program.

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR REDMAN: SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR VOLKOW:

"THAT staff investigate and report on the composition of the gypsy moth spray and further, THAT the Provincial Government be requested to reinstate the process for atrisk persons to be notified in advance of the spray times."

Councillor Corrigan extended congratulations to the Burnaby Minor Hockey Association for organization of a very successful Bantam "AAA' Tournament during the recent holiday season.

Councillor Harris inquired as to when the report will be forthcoming with respect to the budget for Millennium projects.

The City Manager, Mr. R.H. Moncur advised that the report should be available for the 2000 January 17 'Open' Council meeting.
