2. Burnaby Continuing Care Facility Beds

The City Manager submitted a report from the Director Planning and Building prepared in response to Council's request regarding changes in Burnaby's inventory of continuing care facility beds. Staff advise the care facility bed stock in Burnaby has decreased since 1981 while the seniors' population has increased. Lower levels of care has been phased out, with the facility bed stock progressively moving to higher care levels since the 1980's; both for financial and social reasons, efforts have been made to help people remain independent and in the community for as long as reasonably possible. Several Burnaby care facilities have been renovated and upgraded since 1981, however, the Health Region has deemed that the majority of Burnaby's care facilities and facility beds require major investment.

As a result, it is recommended Council write to the Simon Fraser Health Region expressing concern that the City receive assurance an appropriate number, type and quality of continuing care beds will continue to be available in Burnaby to meet the needs of local residents.

The City Manager recommended:

- 1. THAT a copy of this report be sent to Paul McDonell, Chair of the Simon Fraser Health Region, along with a letter which
 - expresses Council's concern with ensuring that an appropriate number, type, and quality of Continuing Care beds continue to be available in Burnaby to meet the needs of local residents over the longer term, and
 - b) indicates the City's ongoing willingness to consult with and assist the Health Region, within the City's mandate and resources, in identifying needs and developing innovative approaches to addressing care facility and related requirements for the local population.

Amendment Regarding the Retention of Full
Service Pumps at Gasoline Service Stations

The City Manager submitted a report from the Director Planning and Building prepared in response to Council's request for further consideration of a proposed zoning bylaw text amendment dealing with retention of full service facilities at Burnaby gas stations.

The City Manager recommended:

THAT the definition of "Gasoline Service Station, Self Serve" in the Burnaby Zoning Bylaw be amended to include a requirement for a minimum of one full serve pump (dual-sided), which shall be in operation form 7:00 am to 11:00 pm or whenever the service station is open for business, whichever is less.

4. Trans Canada Trail - Port Moody Connection

The City Manager submitted a report from the Director Planning and Building requesting Council approval to amend the alignment of the Trans Canada trail from the east side of Burnaby Mountain into Port Moody. The rerouting of the trail arises from concerns by the Trans Canada Trail Foundation that the original trail alignment was unsafe as it traverses a large number of major roads.

As a result, the foundation has requested a trail alignment closer to the waterfront to provide a safer connection into Port Moody and to take advantage of the spectacular views along Burrard Inlet.

The City Manager recommended:

- 1. THAT Council approve, in principle, an amendment to the Trans Canada Trail alignment connection into Port Moody as outlined in this report.
- 2. THAT Council authorize staff to obtain Statutory Rights-of-Way over B.C. Hydro-owned properties to accommodate the Trans Canada Trail as outlined in this report.
- 3. THAT a copy of this report be referred to the Parks, Recreation& Culture Commission for information.

Phase I of the project proposes to construct a new Millennium garden on the north side of Burnaby City Hall and redevelopment of the walkways on the north and east sides of the City Hall, primarily in response to safety and maintenance issues.

 THAT Council award a contract in the amount of \$682,981 (inclusive of GST at 7%) to Bynett Construction Services Ltd., for the construction of Phase 1 of the year 2000 Burnaby Millennium Capital Legacy Project.

At the 'Open' meeting on 2000 July 31, Council received correspondence from the District of Sicamous requesting the City of Burnaby support a resolution opposing the implementation of the sales tax on vessels and recreational vehicles owned by non-residents of the Province.

AND WHEREAS an imposition of a 7% tax on vessels and RV's left for storage would greatly affect the economic stability of marinas and recreational parks in the Kootenay, Thompson, Shuswap, Okanagan and Vancouver Island areas because boat owners and RV owners would be very likely to take their boats home at the end of each season;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Union of B.C. Municipalities petition the British Columbia Ministry of Finance to stay the collection of this tax for the above purpose;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Ministry of Finance **AMEND** the Social Services Act, Section 16 (1) (c) (i,ii,iii,iv,& v) so that vessels and RV's stored in British Columbia are not subject to the 7% tax."
