A) Jennifer Sullivan, 8055 18th Avenue, Burnaby appeared before Council to discuss the current status of the E.B. Floden Farmhouse and urge Council to save the heritage house from demolition as proposed by the new owners of the property.

Council acknowledged receipt of a petition containing the signatures of 86 local residents, the contents of which reads as follows:

"The intention of this survey is to gather opinions regarding the fate of the E.B. Floden Farmhouse, the landmark 1929 Dutch Colonial located at 7997 18th Avenue in East Burnaby.

By identifying yourself in the space below, you record your preference to see this character home retained, and therefore encourage your City Council to postpone any demolition permits until such time that this sensitive matter can be discussed with all possible options at hand."

In response to the delegation's presentation, Council advised that, prior to the Council meeting, staff presented a somewhat unusual option which might be available in this particular instance. The City presently owns a 72 foot wide lot and house which is vacant and boarded up approximately one block away at 7244 4th Street. Staff advised that, potentially, the vacant house could be demolished, a new foundation built and the *"Floden"* house could be relocated to this lot, designated as a heritage house by the City and resold. Staff also noted that the lot is surplus to City needs.

B) George Viras, Owner/Operator of "*Pub Med*", 6879 Kingsway, Burnaby appeared before Council to discuss Rezoning Reference #00-21.

Mr. Viras suggested that the patio roof enclosure is architecturally pleasing and useful to accommodate the smoking clientele. The liquor lines were drawn 12 years ago on the patio and these lines have been followed and kept the same since that time. \$30,000 has been spent to make the patio area functional and appealing and the patio meets the 50% criteria once the side windows are removed as stated as a choice by the Liquor Control Board.

With respect to the loading bay, Mr. Viras advised that the entire parking lot is at their disposal for deliveries from 6:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Also, if he were forced to tear down the office and storage room area, he would not have room for computers, printers, the surveillance system, legal documents, hard liquor and an area to administer the business.

Mr. Viras further advised that various proposals have been submitted to the Planning Department regarding alley access in terms of manoeuverability and the Planning Department has rejected, continuously, everything that has been proposed. The deadline to commence construction was planned for January in order to realize an April completion. Any further delay would extend completion into the Summer months which could adversely affect his business.
