### SUBJECT: 2000/2001 COMMUNITY SCHOOL GRANT

#### **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

- 1. THAT expenditure of \$312,780 as the City's share of the funds for seven Community Schools be approved.
- 2. THAT Council authorize the execution of an agreement with the Burnaby School Board for the support and operation of seven Community Schools.

#### **REPORT**

At its February meeting, the District Community School Advisory and Coordinating Committee approved the 2000/2001 Community School budget, and requested that the School District and City of Burnaby provide the funds for the operation of Community Schools during the 2000/2001 school year.

Attached is a letter from the School District outlining the operating budget and the sources of funding. As indicated in the details of the operating budget, there is an increase of 2.26% over the 1999/2000 operating budget. This is the first increase since 1995 and was required to meet the collective agreement salary increases and inflation.

The amount of \$312,780 will be identified in the City's Annual Operating Budget.

# 2000/2001 COMMUNITY SCHOOL OPERATING BUDGET INFORMATION

The community school program in Burnaby is supported by an integrated funding model involving the school district, City of Burnaby, Ministry for Children and Families and community residents.

The City of Burnaby and school district have an operating agreement which outlines the process for receiving community school designation status and a funding formula to support community school operations.


The Ministry for Children and Families through a contract with the school district supports the community school program as well as other social equity programs such as school meals, inner city education, early intervention and prevention initiatives.

The funding base used to calculate the city and school district's yearly funding support allocation is \$89,366 per community school. This is the first increase in the base since 1995 and results in a 2.26 percent increase in the amount requested from the school district and city. The increase is required to meet salary increases and for inflation.

The cost to operate one community school for 2000/2001 is \$112,888.

The community school budget merges the school district (school year July 1 - June 30) with the city (calendar year Jan. 1 - December 31) to produce an 18-month budget cycle. It is further complicated by the MCF provincial budget year (April 1 - March 31).

The following graphic may be helpful in understanding how the budget partnership works:



It is important to note that each community school through their community council or neighbourhood association raise significant additional dollars from a variety of sources to support programs and services.
