**60-21-133 Watermain Renewals (2000 Program - Phase IV)**

**Charge:** 2000 Provisional Capital Budget \$600,000  
Water Utility

**Additional Information:** Appearing elsewhere on this agenda is an item recommending the award of Contract 2000-01: Watermain Renewals (2000 Program - Phase IV). Watermains with a history of frequent breaks and high maintenance costs are replaced prior to roadworks on streets that are being upgraded through annual pavement rehabilitation and local improvement programs. Total project cost, including ancillary work by City forces, is estimated at \$600,000. Sufficient General Revenue funds are available and these expenditures are included in the Water Utility component of the 2000 - 2004 Provisional Capital Program.

**60-32-105 Drainage Improvements (Burnaby's share) - Various Locations**

**Charge:** 2000 Provisional Capital Budget \$20,000  
Storm Drainage

**Additional Information:** The 2000 Provisional Capital Budget includes provision for cost-sharing with private development to eliminate short sections of open ditch beyond development sites. The program takes advantage of the development process in providing a cost-effective solution for upgrading the infrastructure. Sufficient General Revenue funds are available and these expenditures are included in the Storm Drainage component of the 2000 - 2004 Provisional Capital Program.
