- A) **Mr. Vic Blancard**, 4630 Highlawn Drive, Burnaby, BC appeared before Council to express opposition to the indemnity increase recently approved by Council.

The speaker also criticized City expenditures on the tower at Burnaby Lake Sports Complex West and the dredging of Burnaby Lake.

Mr. Blancard submitted an invoice to the City for cleaning curbs and gutters and maintaining the boulevard in front of his home.

- B) Mr. Phil Mills, 7949 Rosewood Street, Burnaby, BC and Mr. Orest Moysiuk, 7931 Rosewood Street, Burnaby, BC** appeared before Council on behalf of a majority of Rosewood Street residents residing between 4th Street and 6th Street to oppose subdivision of 7938 Rosewood Street into three lots. The residents advised they are not opposed to subdivision of the property into two fifty foot lots, but do oppose subdivision into three lots.

The residents submitted a map showing several similar developments within the same neighbourhood area bounded by Goodlad Street, Wedgewood Street, 6th Street and Canada Way.

Mr. Moysiuk contends that subdivision into three lots would not be in character with the balance of the neighbourhood.

The delegation provided an historical overview of the neighbourhood noting that Rosewood Street was previously named Campbell Street and was possibly divided into two blocks. Mr. Moysiuk noted there is no small lot development on Rosewood Street between 4th Street and 6th Street and the current proposal would go against Council's current policy.

Mr. Phil Mills expressed concerns about the negative impact of small lot development on the character of the neighbourhood and requested that Council not approve three small lots.

The Traffic and Transportation Committee (Traffic Safety Division) submitted a report prepared in response to concerns raised regarding traffic speeds along Cariboo Road between Armstrong and Tenth Avenue. The Committee advises a vehicle count and speed study have determined a significant difference in speeds between northbound and southbound traffic. As a possible solution to the traffic speed concern, the Committee proposes to reduce the effective available width of southbound travel along Cariboo Road. This would be done with pavement markings and lateral delineation to create the effect of a fully utilized parking lane.

Staff will continue to monitor vehicle activity along this portion of a roadway and report back to the Committee following a trial period.
