Re: Vehicle Volume Along Frances Street
west of Holdom Avenue**

The Traffic and Transportation Committee (Traffic Safety Division) submitted a report responding to resident concerns of excessive volume and speed along Frances Street directly west of Holdom Avenue. Based on data collected and observations made on site, staff cannot conclude that there is a high volume of extraneous traffic travelling west along Frances Street from Holdom Avenue or

that speeds are excessive relative to other City streets. Furthermore, the absence of reported crashes involving cyclists and pedestrians suggests that roadway safety for vulnerable road users at this location is not at issue. Accordingly, no action is proposed apart from the general monitoring of the Frances/Union bike route.
