10 KILOMETRE RUN - SEPTEMBER 22, 2002

PURPOSE:

To seek Council approval for the Canucks Training Camp 10K Run

RECOMMENDATION:

1. **THAT** Council approve the 10K Run as discussed in this report.

2. **THAT** the coordinator of the event, Neil Wakelin, Area Manager, Denman Running Room, #103-679 Denman Street, Vancouver, BC, V6G 2L3 be sent a copy of this report.

REPORT

A request to use City streets and boulevards for a 10K run on Sunday, September 22, 2002 has been received from Neil Wakelin, Area Manager for the Denman Running Room. Council approval is required by the Street and Traffic Bylaw.

The Canucks Training Camp 10K Run is to be held on Sunday, September 22, 2002, starting at 10 a.m. in the parking lot of the Burnaby 8 Rinks Complex and finishing at 11:00 a.m. at the same location.

The course will start at the parking lot and turning right onto Norland Avenue heading north to Laurel Street, right on Laurel Street and another right at Gateway Sports Complex West. Runners will proceed through to the next Gateway and then left onto Joe Sakic Way. At Kensington, the runners will turn left and run along the curb lane on the west side of Kensington (which will be coned off) to a paved pathway that leads underneath the overpass. The course then proceeds back along the pathway on the east side of Kensington to Joe Sakic Way. The runners then turn left onto Joe Sakic Way and proceed to Sperling Avenue, a right on Sperling and a quick left onto another gravel pathway that goes around the Burnaby Sports Complex back onto Sperling. They continue south on Sperling to Roberts, left on Roberts to a turn-around and back the same way.

Proceeds from the 10K run go directly to the Canucks Kids Program.

The organizers are aware that approval is subject to the following conditions:

- 1. That the 10K run be conducted under the supervision of one person as Marshall or organizer.
- 2. That all participants be instructed to respect the rights and property of the individuals encountered en route.
- 3. That the 10K run be covered with liability insurance in the minimum amount of \$2 million with the City of Burnaby named as co-insured, and that the insurance policy include a 30 day cancellation notice and a cross liability clause.
