PURPOSE: To request approval to initiate and fund advertising of the 2002 Environmental Awards Program call for nominations.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

1. **THAT** Council be requested to approve the call for nominations for the 2002 Environmental Awards Program as outlined in this report, with an allocation of \$1,230 for advertisements in the local newspapers.

**REPORT**

The City's Environmental Awards Program, which consists of the Environment Awards and the Environmental Stars, is intended to recognize environmental works and achievements by members of the community. The Environment Awards, first presented in 1996 and presented annually during Environment Week since that time, recognize outstanding environmental achievements. The Environmental Stars, which was initiated in 2000, is intended to recognize significant environmental works not accommodated by the Environment Awards.

As a preliminary step to the presentation of the 2002 Environment Awards and Environmental Stars during Environment Week (the first week of June), it is proposed that the call for nominations commence in February. The call for nominations would be placed in the following:

- InfoBurnaby (February edition)
- City's web page (What's New section)
- Advertisements in the local newspapers
- Local libraries and recreation centres

In addition, a memo would be circulated to all City departments, local schools, the School District and community stewardship groups to further solicit input.

The cost associated with the placement of the advertisements in the local newspapers is approximately \$1,230. In previous years, this was drawn from the Council Committees and Boards' budget. With the concurrence of the Committee and Council, staff will proceed with the call for nominations as outlined above. It is also requested that Council approve an allocation of \$1,230 from the Council Committees and Boards' budget for costs associated with the advertisements in the local newspapers.
