His Worship, Mayor Derek R. Corrigan submitted a report requesting Council approval for the cost of hosting the 2003 Municipal Appreciation Dinner, the only function held annually for the purpose of giving special recognition and appreciation to persons serving on Boards, Committees and Commissions of Council, at an estimated cost of \$27,000. Approval was also requested for the appointment of the Kushiro Cup Selection Committee to select the 2002 Citizen of the Year.

His Worship, Mayor Derek R. Corrigan recommended:

B) Traffic Safety Committee Re: Bus Stops on 12th Avenue

The Traffic Safety Committee submitted a report to Council reviewing parking supply and management to facilitate larger events at the Alan Emmott Centre. The Committee advised that staff will pursue increasing the number of parallel spaces and implementing time-limited parking. Once construction in the area is completed, current parking pressure is also expected to diminish.

The Traffic Safety Committee submitted a report to Council recommending enclosure of the pedestrian overpass of Gaglardi Way which links the Forest Grove Drive and Stoney Creek residential areas. The Committee advised that this pedestrian structure is more at risk as a potential launching point for projectiles because of its relative seclusion. The opportunity for effective enforcement to counter vandalism is limited and therefore staff concur with the police recommendation to enclose the pedestrian structure.

The Traffic Safety Committee recommended:

1. THAT Council approve the enclosure of the pedestrian overpass of Gaglardi Way at an estimated cost of \$70,000.

The Committee concludes this project warrants further consideration and detailed design in the context of pedestrian safety improvements. The cost of the work could then be included in a future Capital Program, as priorities warrant.

F) The City Manager presented Report No. 5, 2003 February 10 on the matters listed following as Items 01 to 06 either providing the information shown or recommending the courses of action indicated for the reasons given:

1. Deregulation in BC's Energy Sector

The City Manager submitted a report from the Director Planning and Building responding to Council's request for a report related to correspondence received by Council at its 2003 January 27 meeting. The correspondence was received from the Citizens for Public Power who are concerned over the prospect of BC Hydro being dismantled and providing Council with information pertaining to the Province's new energy plans and policies. Staff advised that the Province's new plans and policies related to energy production, transmission and distribution in BC involve a deregulated energy sector and a significantly restructured BC Hydro and it is acknowledged that this subject is complex. The report, while recognizing certain underlying principles behind the Province's Energy Plan, focusses on key areas of concern that have been raised in the correspondence to Council by Mr. Abram of Citizens for Public Power. Serious concern has been raised that, under the proposed approach, prices for electricity will rise dramatically, new sources for energy will involve unsustainable sources such as fossil fuels (namely coal), environmental quality will be jeopardized, job loss will occur, further cuts to government programs will be required to fund energy rebate programs or to cover other losses in the deregulated energy sector, sovereignty over decision making will be severely deteriorated or lost completely, and urban-rural and wealthy non-wealthy disparities will be exacerbated. Finally, because of international trade arrangements staff suggest that there may be no turning back on such a policy.

Further, staff report that the Province's deal with Accenture is a key component of its overall strategy to restructure BC Hydro and broaden private sector involvement in BC's energy sector. It is indicated that this deal ought to be seriously questioned for several reasons. First, it may well mark the first step of the Province's apparent (unstated)plan to incrementally privatize the energy sector in BC, which would lead the Province down the path of abating its ability, and some would argue its responsibility, to use the public utility, and the profits it brings to the Province, for other important public policy objectives. Second, the deal with Accenture and the development of the Province's new energy plans and policies have thus far taken place without any meaningful public consultation or a process of involvement of major stakeholders. Finally, Accenture's base being in Bermuda casts doubt as to whether the Province could ever enforce its legal rights or recover damages in the event that legal action is required.

For these reasons, and in light of the lessons learned from other jurisdictions which have undergone deregulation of their energy sectors, staff recommend that Council send a letter and a copy of this report to Burnaby MLAs, to the Premier, Cabinet, and UBCM urging them to take a principled stand and vote against any legislation that would privatize BC Hydro in the absence of a full and meaningful public consultation process, as outlined in the correspondence from the Citizens for Public Power received by Council on 2003 January 27. Similarly, staff recommend that Council reiterate its support for the UBCM resolution calling for a halt to the currently proposed deal between BC Hydro and Accenture Inc. pending the conclusion of a more detailed analysis and public consultation process on the matter.

The City Manager recommended:

- THAT Council write Burnaby MLAs, the Premier and Cabinet to express its concerns over the prospect of a deregulated energy sector in BC and to oppose any privatization of BC Hydro, as well as to request that a public consultation process be undertaken in respect of these matters.
- 2. THAT Council reiterate its support for the UBCM resolution which calls for the halt to the joint venture agreement between BC Hydro and Accenture Inc, which would see at least one third of BC Hydro's current employees transferred to the Bermuda-based company, until public consultation occurs.
- 3. THAT Council forward a copy of this report to Burnaby MLAs, the Premier and Cabinet, the UBCM. the BC Utilities Commission and to Mr. Jim Abram c/o the Citizens for Public Power.
