Councillor Rankin introduced discussion surrounding a recent "leaked document" from the RCMP stating that as of 2003 April 02 there will only be one RCMP detachment in the Lower Mainland, not sixteen stand alone detachments. Councillor Rankin was granted leave to introduce the following motion:

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR RANKIN:
SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR EVANS:

"THAT staff prepare a report on the impact of the regionalization of RCMP services throughout the Lower Mainland."
