A) Anne Waller, Administrator, Burnaby Volunteer Services, appeared before Council to present a brief summary of the Citizen Support Services 2004 Annual Report.

Ms. Waller outlined the mission of support services: connecting people with people. The speaker outlined the various programs which are staffed by more than 300 volunteers.

In 2004, Volunteer Services interviewed and trained 100 new volunteers and 161 new senior clients were interviewed and are now receiving services. Volunteers also assisted the Fraser Health Authority professional staff with 6,002 visits to children's services, three pre-school fairs and hearing tests for 1618 kindergarten children.

Ms. Waller introduced three very special volunteers in attendance at the meeting: Les Lee Lowe, Grace Joe and Thomas Mark, each of whom have been recognized as the City of Burnaby's Outstanding Citizen of the Year.

In conclusion, Ms. Waller expressed appreciation to all those who volunteer in Burnaby for their dedication to the community.

His Worship, Mayor Derek R. Corrigan thanked Anne Waller for her enthusiasm and leadership as Administrator of Citizen Support Services. Mayor Corrigan announced the names of the recipients of the Citizen Support Services' volunteer awards for 2005. They are as follows:

Councillor Calendino retired from the Council meeting at 7:18 p.m.

Councillor Calendino returned to the Council Chamber at 7:20 p.m. and took his place at the Council table.

B) Ms. Anne Murray, Vice President, Community and Environment Affairs and Mr. Bob Cowan, Senior Vice President, Engineering, Vancouver International Airport Authority appeared before Council to provide an overview of the Vancouver International Airport's initiatives and activities in 2004. Mr. Cowan advised that in 2004, the airport hosted 15.7 million passengers, which was an increase of 9.8% over 2003. Air traffic also showed a similar percentage increase.

The speaker reviewed the capital projects undertaken in 2004. In light of the recovery of air traffic volumes, capital projects concentrated on alleviating the pressures put on the current infrastructure by adding new space and making processes more efficient. A small terminal was built for West Jet and the expansion of the International Terminal was launched last December, with completion anticipated in 2007. Another key initiative was security and Mr. Cowan provided an overview of the new Nexus program, which will use retinal identification technology for customs clearance.

Ms. Murray advised that the continued increases in air traffic and maintenance of the south runway will result in the use of the north runway for departures. Until now, the north runway has primarily been used for arrivals. Ms. Murray assured Council the airport will do its best to mitigate noise resulting from this change.

Ms. Murray advised that in November 2004, Vancouver hosted "Forum 44", which looked 40 years into the future in order to assist in long range planning initiatives. The group used a 'sustainability lens' to focus the conversation, so it was not limited to economics and business but included social, environmental and governance aspects. Resulting from the success of this forum, the Airport Authority will be holding three more sessions in April: a one day event to receive input from the clients and passengers of the future (18 – 30 year olds); an event for communities around the Province which are served by the airport and a public forum will be held on the future of the airport.

In conclusion, Ms. Murray invited everyone to the annual general meeting which will be held on 2005 May 12 at 3:30 p.m. at the airport. Their Annual Report and additional information will be available on their website at: www.yvr.ca.

C) Thomas Maruk, 2170 Kensington Avenue, Burnaby, B.C. appeared before Council to explain circumstances relating to the property at 2170 Kensington Avenue.

Mr. Maruk advised that following the death of his father he was faced with the task of cleaning up the property. The speaker advised that he has been cleaning up the property as he is able and to date he has taken 6,890 lbs to salvage and 4,752 lbs to the dump.

In conclusion, Mr. Maruk advised Council that he does not have the money to pay the City to clean up the property on his behalf and he requires more time to clean up the property himself.
