- A) **Ms. Katy Alkins-Jang**, Chair Burnaby Public Library and **Ms. Edel Toner-Rogala**, Chief Librarian, Burnaby Public Library appeared before Council to present the Library's 2004 Annual Report.

Ms. Alkins-Jang introduced members of the Library Board in attendance at the Council meeting.

The speaker outlined the results of a strategic planning process undertaken by the Library Board noting that a primary focus for the library is to become more involved in the Community-at-large through partnerships with other community organizations.

Ms. Alkins-Jang referred to highlights from 2004 including more than 5,000 visitors per day over the four libraries, borrowing 4 million items over the course of the year.

The 2004 summer reading club was extremely successful with 700 children receiving medals, donated by the Royal Bank, for their participation. The medals were presented at a pancake breakfast provided by Connections at the Holiday Inn.

In 2005 the speaker was pleased to announce summer reading club participants will receive a ticket to a Vancouver Canadians Baseball game made possible by a contribution from the Vancouver Canadians team.

Ms. Alkins-Jang advised the Library Board is looking forward to involvement in the design and construction of the proposed new Kingsway Library.

In conclusion, Ms. Alkins-Jang expressed appreciation to Council for their continued support of the Burnaby Public Library and its programs.

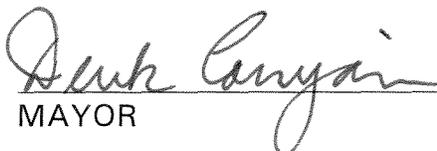
