The Executive Committee of Council submits the following recommendations for Council's approval:

#22/05 Kensington Community Fair

RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT a one-time only grant in the amount of \$2,500 be awarded to the Greystone/Lochdale Community Association for the 2005 Kensington Community Fair.

REPORT

An application was received from Greystone/Lochdale Community Association requesting a grant to assist with the cost of the 2005 Kensington Community Fair scheduled for Saturday, August 06 at Kensington Park. For the past several years, the event has attracted an average of 4,000 youth and parents from the Kensington area. This year the Fair will have approximately 40 participating groups, along with a mini-midway and service clubs serving food.

#25/05 East Burnaby Family Place

RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT a one-time only grant in the amount of \$300 be awarded to East Burnaby Family Place to assist with the purchase of a stove.

REPORT

An application was received requesting a grant toward the cost of a stove to be used in providing a free lunch program at East Burnaby Family Place. This non-profit community house for children and their parents or caregivers provides a toy lending library, resource centre, clothing exchange, volunteer opportunities and a fully qualified early childhood education teacher.

#29/05 Edmonds Town Centre Mural Project

RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT a grant in the amount of \$5,000 be awarded to Edmonds Town Centre Business and Community Association for the Edmonds Town Centre Mural Project.

REPORT

An application was received requesting a start-up grant for the Edmonds Town Centre Mural Project. This project began with a painting day held on 2005 April 30 as part of the Edmonds "Clean Sweep" event. Area youth were invited to do art work.

The Edmonds Town Centre Business and Community Association advised that this mural project will reduce the amount of graffiti in the area and at the same time show the history and future of Edmonds Town Centre.

28 potential mural sites have been identified on Edmonds Street from Kingsway to Canada Way. Other sites to be considered include the SkyTrain tunnel at B.C. Hydro.

#31/05 2005 Global Young Leaders Conference (GYLC) – Ms. Amanda van Aggelen and Ms. Amanda Reid - 2005 SHAD Valley Program - Ms. Amanda van Aggelen

RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT these grant requests be denied.

REPORT

An application was received requesting a grant to assist with the cost of Amanda van Aggelen's participation in the 2005 Global Young Leaders Conference and/or the Shad Valley Program. A second application was received requesting a grant to assist with the cost of Amanda Reid's participation in the Global Young Leaders Conference. Both of these Burnaby High School students have demonstrated strong leadership skills and achieved excellent academic standing.

The GYLC is hosted in Washington, D.C. and in New York City. More than 100 countries will send exceptional young leaders with a variety of backgrounds and a broad range of interests and goals to this conference. These young women and men will learn the diplomatic, social and economic lessons of the past, debate the policies of the present and prepare for positions of national and global leadership in the future.

Shad Valley is a comprehensive program in co-ordination with 11 of Canada's universities. Amanda will be attending Queen's University in Kingston, Ontario. The program focuses on developing leadership and entrepreneurship among Canada's top performing youth.

#32/05 Volunteer Burnaby

RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT a grant in the amount of \$14,000 be awarded to Volunteer Burnaby for the year 2005.

REPORT

An application was received requesting a grant to assist with delivery of services provided by Volunteer Burnaby. Many non-profit agencies and groups list detailed volunteer positions on Volunteer Burnaby's database. The organization's website includes a full description of services, programs and screening information. In addition, Volunteer Burnaby works closely with schools and student volunteers, operates a special needs access program for adults with developmental disabilities and provides volunteer training and recruitment skills to non-profit groups.

#33/05& #34/05 Burnaby Renshikan Karate Club

RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT a grant in the amount of \$150 be awarded to Burnaby Renshikan Karate Club to assist with Matt Bickel's travel expenses to the 2005 Pan American Junior Karate Championship.
2. THAT a grant in the amount of \$250 (\$125 x 2 Burnaby residents) be awarded to Burnaby Renshikan Karate Club to assist with Cody Martin's and Andrea Maikawa's travel expenses to the 2005 National Karate Championship.

REPORT

Applications were received requesting grants to assist with Matt Bickel's travel expenses to the 2005 Pan American Junior Karate Championships to be held in Montevideo, Uruguay from August 27 to September 03 and Cody Martin's and Andrea Maikawa's travel expenses to the 2005 National Karate Championship held in Halifax, Nova Scotia from April 07 to 09.

Matt Bickel, a 15 year old Burnaby resident, is a member of the Canadian National Junior team and a three time Provincial Champion. Meanwhile, Cody Martin and Andrea Maikawa, 14 and 15 year old Burnaby residents, both won at the Provincial Championship held in North Vancouver on 2005 January 20.

At the 2005 National Karate Championship Matt won silver and bronze medals while Cody and Andrea each won bronze medals.

#35/05 Odyssey of the Mind World Finals (Seaforth Elementary School and South Slope Elementary School)

RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT a grant in the amount of \$1,950 (\$150 x 13 students) be awarded to two Odyssey of the Mind teams at Seaforth Elementary School to assist with travel expenses to the 2005 Odyssey of the Mind World finals to be held in Boulder, Colorado.

2. THAT a grant in the amount of \$900 (\$150 x 6 students) be awarded to one Odyssey of the Mind Team at South Slope Elementary School to assist with travel expenses to the 2005 Odyssey of the Mind World Finals to be held in Boulder, Colorado.

REPORT

Applications were received from Odyssey of the Mind teams at Seaforth Elementary School and South Slope Elementary School requesting a grant to assist with the cost of sending the teams to the Odyssey of the Mind World Finals to be held at the University of Colorado from May 21 to 24. Each team won at the B.C. Championship held in 2005 April.

Odyssey of the Mind is an international program for kids of all ages that promotes creativity, logic and teamwork in a problem solving competition.

RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT a one-time only grant in the amount of \$500 be awarded to Glenwood Elementary School to assist with the cost of activities and events commemorating the 100th Anniversary of the school.

REPORT

An application was received requesting a grant to assist with the cost of celebrating the 100th Anniversary of Glenwood Elementary School. A number of projects are planned. Students are preparing to interview seniors, former students from the late 1920's and early 1930's, and others in the community with a strong sense of history. A school field trip to Burnaby Village Museum introduced children to life in 1925 and inspired a quilting project. In addition, a community wide 100th anniversary celebration is planned for 2005 October.
