GRAHAM PARK - DEMOLITION OF STRUCTURES AT 7975 GRAHAM

AVENUE, LOT 3, D.L. 28, PLAN 10397, GROUP 1.

RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT Council be requested to authorize the sale for moving or salvage or demolition of the structures and all outbuildings at 7975 Graham Avenue.

REPORT

The Chief Licence Inspector has requested that the removal and/or demolition of the City-owned structure and all outbuildings at 7975 Graham Avenue be put forward for consideration by the Parks, Recreation and Culture Commission and Council. The subject property was acquired in 1993 March for inclusion in Graham Park. The location of the subject property is illustrated in the attached sketch. The land assembly program for the Graham Park is almost complete with one property yet to be acquired, therefore, it is anticipated that the interim holding period for the subject property will be five years or less.

The subject property is improved with a vacant 800 square feet residential dwelling built in 1949. The building is in poor to fair condition and repairs would have to be undertaken in order to bring the dwelling to current City rental standards. Engineering Department staff have inspected the building and concur that it is not economically viable to renovate the building for rental purposes. The structures are not listed on the City Heritage Inventory or Community Heritage Register.

Parks Department staff support the proposed removal and/or demolition and recommend that Commission and Council approve the Chief License Inspector's request.
