A) Mr. Ron Carne, 6392 Neville Street, appeared before Council to share the 2005 Byrne Creek Watershed Status report. Highlights were provided in a visual presentation.

Mr. Carne identified and reviewed the following watershed health indicators: the spawners; resident fish; sedimentation and erosion; bug survey; discharge measurements; invasive plants and Streamkeepers. The delegation advised there are more than 30 active Streamkeepers who last year volunteered 982 hours to the restoration and preservation of the Byrne Creek watershed.

The speaker advised the Streamkeepers initiate and participate in many activities to help increase public awareness including: information booths; storm drain markings; and the very successful Stream of Dreams. They also give watershed tours to school, community and tourist groups. Mr. Carne advised the Streamkeepers are currently planning a tour for Burnaby City Council, senior City staff, Burnaby MPs and MLAs to take place in early Spring. Councillor Evans

Councillor Evans advised that as a result of a family emergency last weekend he had experienced the state of the emergency facilities at Burnaby General Hospital first hand and was appalled by the conditions and the overcrowding.

Council agreed cuts to health care are impacting Burnaby's hospital and suggested citizens speak up and contact their MLAs. Council noted it has been two years since the last time the City had met with the Fraser Health Authority and requested staff arrange a meeting between Council and the Authority.

Councillor Rankin retired from the Council Chamber at 7:55 p.m.

Councillor Rankin returned to the Council Chamber at 7:58 p.m. and took his place at the Council table.

Council noted that someone had observed 87 jaywalkers at that location within one hour. The Director Engineering advised an analysis of this location would be conducted.
