SUBJECT: BARNET BOOK 2006 REPRINTING

PURPOSE: To allocate funds to reprint "*In the Shadow by the Sea: Recollections of Burnaby's Barnet Village*"

RECOMMENDATION:

THAT the Community Heritage Commission request Council to approve the expenditure of up to \$5,000.00 to reprint the book "*In the Shadow by the Sea: Recollections of Burnaby's Barnet Village*" as outlined in this report.

R E P O R T

In 2005 Burnaby's Community Heritage Commission (CHC) completed, through the leadership of historian and CHC member Harry Pride, a new book titled - "*In the Shadow by the Sea: Recollections of Burnaby's Barnet Village*", which celebrates the unique history of the City's Barnet district. The initial press run of 300 copies is sold out and a reprinting is necessary given the sustained level of public demand for this City publication.

An estimate for reprinting this book has been prepared so that it may now proceed towards production. The cost is not to exceed \$5000.00 and is available in the Commission's 2006 annual budget. It is proposed that this publication take advantage of the new print-on-demand technology available through the City print shop, which will allow a small quantity print-run to be produced at a reasonable cost. The cost of printing and binding each book is valued at \$25.00 each. The cost of printing will be recovered through book sales as it is proposed to sell the book for \$30.00 (not including applicable taxes). Taking into account the current orders on hand and estimated future demands for the publication, it would be advisable to print 200 copies at this time. The books will be produced in time for a Barnet residents' reunion picnic to be held Sunday, July 23rd in Barnet Marine Park.
