5. **NEW BUSINESS**

Councillor Rankin

Councillor Rankin circulated a copy of an article appearing in the Vancouver Sun newspaper regarding a proposed development in Surrey Central. Councillor Rankin expressed concern about the article in which Cameron McNeill, MAC Real Estate Marketing Solutions is quoted as describing Burnaby's Metrotown as

"a mall surrounded by residential highrises". Council Rankin noted that the neither the realtor, nor the reporter appear to be aware that Metrotown offers numerous community amenities, including a civic centre, library, recreation centre, schools, sports fields, golf course, fire hall, major transit exchange, a multi-cultural centre, significant park areas and a community theatre.

Arising from discussion, Councillor Rankin was granted leave by Council to introduce the following motion:

Corrigan write letter to Cameron McNeill, MAC Real Estate Marketing Solutions, with a copy sent to the Vancouver Sun, pointing out that, while City of Burnaby supports the City of Surrey in its development of a new downtown area, it is inappropriate to make negative and unfair comparisons between developments in one city and another and to educate them about the diverse community and benefits available in the Metrotown neighbourhood."
