His Worship, Mayor Derek R. Corrigan, announced the passing of Burnaby Freeman David Mowat Herd on Sunday, March 04th, one month short of his 90th Birthday.

Mayor Corrigan advised that Freeman Herd lived and worked his entire life in Burnaby, passionately dedicated to his community and his family. Elected as an Alderman from 1964 until 1970, he served on many Council boards, committees and commissions prior to, during and after this time. On March 30th, 1984, the City of Burnaby bestowed the honour of Freeman of the City upon David Mowat Herd.

Freeman Herd took this honour to heart and served as an excellent ambassador for the community.

Mayor Corrigan asked everyone in attendance at the meeting to stand for one minute of silence in honour of Freeman Dave Herd. On behalf of Council and the citizens of Burnaby, Mayor Corrigan expressed sincere condolences to Dave's wife, Lillian and their family and noted that a celebration of Dave Herd's life would be held on Friday, March 09th at 1:30 p.m. at the James Cowan Theatre located at Shadbolt Centre for the Arts.

2. DELEGATION

A) Ernst Roschat,

Re: Concerns of Buckingham Avenue area Residents regarding proposed upgrades to Buckingham Avenue

Speaker: Ernst Roschat

CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

A) Mr. Ernst Roschat, 5255 Buckingham Avenue, Burnaby, B.C. and his neighbours Mr. Patrick Gillan and Mrs. Carol Stinson appeared before Council on behalf of the residents of lower Buckingham Avenue to discuss road improvements in their neighbourhood. Mr. Roschat stated that several years back, the GVRD, in cooperation with the City of Burnaby, approved the installation of a water main for the purpose of servicing Greater Vancouver. Part of this proposal included Buckingham Avenue and as such the local residents have been subjected to the accompanying inconveniences associated with a project of this magnitude. The speaker noted their disappointment lies within the fact that they were left out of an opportunity to upgrade Buckingham Avenue to a finished residential street including concrete curbs, a standard 5 foot sidewalk, finished boulevards, improved lighting and a storm drain.

Mr. Roschat suggested it is the responsibility of the City's Planning and Engineering Departments to take the initiative in coordinating upgrades during the planning stage of extensive projects. The delegation believes this would result in substantial cost savings to both the City of Burnaby as well as the taxpayers.

Mr. Pat Gillan submitted a presentation on the construction in the neighbourhood currently undertaken by the GVRD expressing particular concerns about the water runoff.

Mrs. Carol Stinson outlined the conditions in the neighbourhood as a result of the GVRD watermain construction. Ms. Stinson noted the construction has been ongoing for five months and listed the various problems encountered from the construction activity, including noise, dust, traffic disruption, delayed delivery of newspapers and delayed garbage pickup. The speaker advised that, in her view, the City should provide the requested upgrades in order to compensate the area residents for the inconvenience of the construction project.

In conclusion, the delegation asked Council as to how they intend to rectify this matter.

His Worship, Mayor Derek R. Corrigan explained to the delegation the process for the Local Improvement Program (LIP) and advised that the City will look at a new policy for LIPs in conjunction with major construction projects.

B) Community Development Committee Re: Affordable Housing and Homelessness – A Response to Issues and Proposals

The Community Development Committee submitted a report providing Council with an overview of housing affordability and homelessness issues. The report responds to various initiatives that others have proposed that could be used to facilitate affordable housing both in the region and the City. While these issues have serious impacts and implications for the health, quality of life and economic viability of the community, they are beyond the mandate, resources and tax base of Burnaby and other local governments to address on a direct basis. As such, the Committee recommends that Council urge both the federal and provincial governments to more aggressively assume their responsibility and role as direct providers of adequate programs, funding and support services to address the gap in affordable housing, both non-market and market related.

The Committee noted that Burnaby has played a key role in the accommodation of the regions non-market housing stock as evidenced by the fact that they City has the second highest number of such units in the region. The Committee further noted the continuing role that Burnaby can play in helping facilitate the

provision and protection of non-market housing in the City and highlighted a number of potential initiatives that would be worthy of further exploration and development for the review and consideration of Council.

The Community Development Committee recommended:

- THAT a copy of this report be forwarded to the Hon. Monte Solberg, Minister of Human Resources and Social Development with the request that the proposed federal initiatives outlined in Section 5.1 be addressed.
- THAT a copy of this report be forwarded to the Honourable Rich Coleman, Minister Responsible for Housing, and B.C. Housing with a request that the proposed provincial initiatives outlined in Section 5.2 of this report be addressed.
- 3. THAT a copy of this report, which provides a proposed City response in Section 5.3.1 to the Draft Discussion Paper on a Regional Affordable Housing Strategy for Greater Vancouver, be sent to the GVRD Board.
- 4. THAT a copy of this report, which provides a proposed City response in Section 5.3.2 to the City of Vancouver's 2006 November 28 motion on homelessness, be sent to the City of Vancouver.
- 5. THAT Council authorize staff to further explore those possible new City initiatives for facilitating affordable housing that have potential financial impacts, and as summarized in Section 6.0 of this report, through the use of specific case examples with the findings and conclusions to be submitted for the subsequent consideration of the Committee and Council.
