RECOMMENDATION:

REPORT

The St. John Ambulance Brigade has a mission of helping citizens improve their health, safety. and quality of life through community service. To accomplish this mission, the organization provides its members with advanced first aid training and supplies so that they possess the skills and confidence to deal with different injuries and illnesses. The St. John Ambulance Brigade provides first aid at approximately 75 events throughout Burnaby each year. These include hockey tournaments, martial arts events, City events at Deer Lake and various festivals.

The organization is requesting a grant to purchase three patient automated external defibrillators (AEDs) and one trainer automated external defibrillator. An AED is a portable device used in cases of cardiac arrest. It delivers a controlled electric shock to the patient.
