A) Ms. Gloria Kravac, 4269 Halley Avenue, Burnaby and Ms. Elsie Dean, 5285 Empire Drive, Burnaby appeared before Council to present highlights of the "Voices of Burnaby Seniors", survey and inform Council of the next steps in their process to meet the needs of Burnaby seniors.

Elsie Dean advised the *"Voices of Burnaby Seniors"* survey was conducted in May and June of 2007. The purpose of the survey was to find answers to the needs of Burnaby seniors; to look at what is working well and what is needed to make Burnaby more senior friendly.

Ms. Dean noted 1085 surveys were distributed and 659 were returned – a 61% return rate. All four quadrants of Burnaby were surveyed and the average age of respondents was 72.

The survey consisted of 100 questions covering topics such as housing, availability of support services, transportation, health and health services, social connections, neighbourhood safety, end of life care and legal services.

In general seniors are satisfied with their quality of life, however, with a growing seniors population concerns were expressed about managing home ownership and rental costs. The senior's greatest concern is maintaining financial independence and remaining in their own homes.

In the second project phase Ms. Dean invited Council and the City to participate in development of a community plan to address the needs of seniors.

In conclusion Ms. Dean thanked Council, survey participants, community agencies and New Horizons for Seniors Programs for their support of the *"Voices of Burnaby Seniors"* project.
