A) Ms. Ardell Brophy, representing the New Westminster and District Labour Council appeared before Council to bring attention to the issue of workplace health and safety. The labour movement joins with communities and local governments across Canada every year to recognize April 28 as the National Day of Mourning for Workers Killed and Injured on the Job.

In 2008 the Board of Directors of WorkSafe BC will conduct public consultation hearings on proposed amendments to the Occupational Health and Safety

Regulations including changes that affect workers in construction, environmental tobacco smoke and the transportation of workers.

The speaker reviewed a variety of legislative changes designed to improve workplace safety standards in such sectors as agriculture, home renovation industry, landscaping and forestry.

In 2008, Working Alone regulations were changed to require prepay at the pump at all BC gas stations.

In conclusion, Ms. Brophy invited the public and Council to learn more about proposed legislative amendments designed to improve Workplace Safety by visiting the WorkSafe BC website.

B) Mr. Premka Nand, 3395 Euclid Avenue, Vancouver, BC appeared before Council to discuss notice of unsightly premises at 4981 and 4991 Claude Avenue, Burnaby, BC.

Mr. Nand advised that he is aware of the problem and has tried to clean it up, however people continue to dump on the site.

The delegation advised he needs an additional 15 days to clean up the property and if he is unable to do so in that time frame, the City is free to clean up the site.

His Worship, Mayor Corrigan advised Mr. Nand that Council will leave the staff report on table for two weeks and at that time, if the property has not been cleared, will issue the order as recommended.
