BYLAW TO FUND PARKS, RECREATION AND CULTURAL

SERVICES 2008 CAPITAL PROJECTS

RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 1. THAT the expenditure of \$7,490,000 from the 2008 Provisional Capital Budget for 10 projects as outlined in this report be approved.
- 2. THAT Council be requested to bring down a bylaw to appropriate \$7,864,500 (inclusive of 5% GST) from Capital Reserves to finance these projects.

REPORT

The 2008 Provisional Capital Budget for Parks, Recreation and Cultural Services contains the following 10 projects to be funded from Capital Reserves. To enable work to go ahead on the following projects, approval is requested to bring down a bylaw for funding.

Regular Program

1. Ernie Winch Park
Continued construction of new park development.

\$50,000

2. Youth Centre

\$300,000

Replacement of South Central Youth Centre with modular building.

3. Wading Pools

\$85,000

Replacement and upgrade to pool decking and fencing.

4. Arenas

\$55,000

Upgrade to Kensington Arena skate shop to improve safety and efficiency with new flooring, cupboards, skate storage, service counter and skate sharpening machine.

5. Golf Courses \$250,000

Continued restoration and improvements to turf, buildings and equipment including irrigation, fences, security and general landscaping.

6. Riverway Golf Course

\$700,000

Continued improvement to the Riverway drainage system on all fairways to improve playability and operating efficiencies.

Major Program

7. Burnaby Lake Sports Complex-West
Construction of artificial turf fields 4 and 5.

8. Kensington Park \$200,000

Construction of baseball field adjacent to the artificial turf field.

9. Sportsfield Renovation Program \$700,000

Upgrades to Kensington fields, washroom construction and various minor upgrades.

10. Burnaby Village Museum

\$150,000

Roof repairs/replacements, drainage upgrades, floor restoration/recovering, paint/wall covering upgrades, walkway resurfacing, HVAC repairs.

Sufficient Capital Reserves are available to complete the above projects in the 2008 Provisional Capital Budget. It is recommended that Council be requested to bring down a bylaw to appropriate \$7,864,500 (inclusive of 5% GST) from Capital Reserves.
