1. Burnaby School Lands

The City Manager submitted a report from the Director Planning and Building advising Council of the historical ownership, acquisition and inventory of school lands in Burnaby and outlining the potential implications of the Ministry of Education's "Disposal of Lands or Improvement Order". The staff report concludes that the City of Burnaby, in partnership with School District #41, has effectively managed the school lands and community assets in trust for Burnaby's children and citizens, as an integral part of its community plans and services. Also, Burnaby schools and sites form a critical part of Burnaby's social infrastructure that provides a substantial contribution to the well-being of every neighbourhood and citizen. Staff raise several specific requirements of the Ministerial Order that raise concerns for the City of Burnaby with respect to the City's legal title interests, historic financial contributions, and the protection of school lands for community purposes.

The City Manager recommended:

- 1. THAT Council, through the Office of the Mayor, write to the Provincial Government through the Minister of Education to request amendment of the Ministerial Order titled "Disposal of Lands or Improvement Order", as outlined in this report, to:
 - a) require consultation with and agreement of local government for school lands and facilities to be listed as surplus to school and community needs;
 - b) make all surplus lands and facilities available for purchase by the local government prior to making the properties available for Provincial uses:
 - seek local government agreement to proposed future uses of surplus school lands prior to the sale, disposal or transfer of the school lands to the Province or other interested private parties;
 - d) require consultation with the local government to determine and document local government and community contributions made

towards the creation of school land and facility assets considered for disposal;

- e) ensure that the proceeds from disposals attributable to local taxpayers are either vested directly in new local school lands and facilities, as originally intended, or returned to the local government;
- f) recognize lands contributed to School Districts 'in trust' for school purposes, and maintain those lands for school purposes or return the lands to the local government as appropriate; and
- g) remove the discretion for the Minister to arbitrarily allocate funds generated from the sale of school assets to the Provincial Government.
- 2. THAT Council authorize staff to pursue implementation of the actions outlined in Section 4.0 of this report to protect the City's financial, legal and Community Plan interests in Burnaby School lands.
- THAT Council authorize staff to draft a UBCM resolution regarding the protection of local Municipal interests in school lands and assets for consideration at the 2009 UBCM convention.

2. Proposed Provincial Prison Facility 3405 Willingdon Avenue

The City Manager submitted a report from the Director Planning and Building responding to the Province's proposal to construct a new prison facility in Burnaby at the subject site. After meeting with Provincial representatives, staff report the subject site does not meet critical site selection criteria for correctional facilities, namely proximity to a courthouse and separation from land uses such as schools, churches, child care facilities, and residential neighbourhoods. Staff also note that a new prison at the subject site would have no relationship with current surrounding development.

The City Manager recommended:

- 1. THAT Council advise the Province that the City is opposed to the proposed development of a new prison facility at the subject site.
- 2. THAT the Province be requested to undertake a broad, open, and consultative review of government and privately-owned sites throughout Metro Vancouver that are potentially suitable for a prison facility.
- 3. THAT the Province be requested to include direct consideration of the following items in its assessment and evaluation of alternative locations for a new prison facility:
 - a) Proximity to an existing court facility;
 - b) The larger development context of the potential prison site; and
 - c) The character of the community surrounding the potential prison site, so to avoid conflict with schools, child care centres, residential areas, and other community-based facilities.
- 4. THAT the Province be requested to give direct consideration to the opportunity costs of pursuing the development of a prison on the Willingdon site, and that the Province consult with the City on supportable property configuration and land use options.

- 5. THAT a copy of this report be sent to all property owners and businesses within the notification area indicated in Sketch #3, together with contact information for the Minister of Public Safety and Solicitor General, so that the community is informed of Council's opposition to the proposal, and to assist the community in providing its views to the Province in anticipation of the forthcoming provincial consultation process and prior to the Province developing more definitive development plans for the prison.

Councillor Dhaliwal

Councillor Dhaliwal was granted leave by Council to introduce the following motion:

MOVED BY COUNCILLOR DHALIWAL: SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR McDONELL:

"THAT WHEREAS British Columbia and Alberta entered into the Trade Investment and Labour Mobility Agreement, in April 2006;

AND WHEREAS the Union of BC Municipalities members expressed grave concerns about many potential impacts upon municipalities, and directed the UBCM to undertake negotiations with the Province to address those concerns;

AND WHEREAS many of the concerns of the UBCM were not addressed in negotiations, including, for example, that BC and Alberta will not amend TILMA to permit local governments to defend their own measures;

AND WHEREAS other Provinces have expressed interest in negotiating TILMA-like interprovincial agreements;

AND WHEREAS the Provincial premiers recently agreed to amend the Agreement on Internal Trade to include \$5 million penalties, and remove barriers to labour mobility;

AND WHEREAS the Federal Government has said that it will target trade barriers between provinces by 2010;

AND WHEREAS municipalities across the country have not had substantive opportunities to assess and respond to agreements like TILMA, and changes to the Agreement on Internal Trade;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Federation of Canadian Municipalities undertake an in-depth evaluation of:

- the potential impact that agreements like TILMA could have on municipalities;
- the potential impact of the amendment of the Agreement on Internal Trade to include \$5 million penalties; and
- the potential impact of other interprovincial trade agreements or provisions being considered by the Federal, Provincial or Territorial governments;

AND THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Federation of Canadian Municipalities calls upon the Federal, Provincial and Territorial governments of Canada to fully consult municipalities, through the Federation of Canadian Municipalities, before entering or amending new or existing interprovincial trade agreements."

Councillor Jordan inquired as to whether staff had any updates on the Royal Canadian Legion and Elizabeth Fry Society social housing projects.

The Director Planning and Building advised that since BC Housing had changed their policies and were no longer prepared to advance funding for projects with covenants, a meeting had taken place between Mayor Corrigan, staff and BC Housing. Mr. Luksun stated a temporary agreement had been reached with BC Housing for funding and therefore final Preliminary Plan Approval had been granted by the City to the Legion.

With regard to the Elizabeth Fry Society project, the Director Planning and Building advised the project would not be advancing as the option on the property had expired and funding from BC Housing was not available. Mr. Luksun noted the funding from BC Housing was based on the Elizabeth Fry Society applying for and receiving funding from the emergency shelter program. The Directory Planning and Building advised the Society applied but was told that funds are no longer available under this or any other program. Mr. Luksun reported BC Housing will be reimbursing the Elizabeth Fry Society for funds expended to date on this project.
