PURPOSE: To request approval of the proposed event program for Environment Week 2009

in Burnaby.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. **THAT** the Committee request Council to approve the proposed event program for Environment Week 2009, as outlined in Appendix A of this report.

2. THAT the Committee request Council to authorize an expenditure of \$6,500 from the Committees, Boards and Commissions budget for advertising and event signage for Environment Week.

REPORT

1.0 BACKGROUND

Environment Week is an annual national event held during the first week in June to raise environmental awareness and encourage environmental stewardship. The City of Burnaby strongly supports and encourages environmental stewardship and, through its Environment Committee, participates in Environment Week by coordinating a variety of public environmental events led by the City, community groups, local businesses, agencies, and other organizations. The City, together with its community partners, has developed a proposed program of events for this year's Environment Week celebration.

This report presents the variety of events that are proposed to celebrate Environment Week 2009. The events provide many different opportunities for community involvement, stewardship, and broad public participation, and are scheduled to occur from mid-May to mid-June.

2.0 PROPOSED ENVIRONMENT WEEK PROGRAM

As approved by Council on the recommendation of the Environment Committee on 2009 February 16, this year's Environment Week theme is "Small Change – Big Impact". The overall objective for this year's program is to empower people to make small changes in their own lives that will have a broader impact on the environment. As such, the proposed Community events

provide opportunities for participants to learn about and make greener choices in their homes, gardens, communities, and workplaces. The community ecosculpture planting event, "Catch the Spirit of Eagles," will be the feature event this year, with community members invited to plant ecosculptures and learn from interactive display material presented by stewardship groups, environmental agencies, businesses, schools, and community groups.

3.0 SPONSORSHIP AND ADVERTISING

Sponsorship of community events have been generously provided by our corporate and community partners. The following sponsorships have been received from:

In addition, Tim Horton's have generously provided in-kind contributions for Environment Week events. Other community sponsors may also be identified over the next month as Environment Week details are finalized.

As in previous years, advertisements will be placed in the local newspapers, including a detailed schedule of events with an invitation to the community to participate. Given the scale of the events, it is proposed that two advertisements run in each community newspaper prior to Environment Week, as well as a single ad in the *Georgia Straight*. In addition, information about Environment Week will be available on the City's web page, at local libraries and recreation centres, and at the City's information booth at Metropolis in Metrotown.

In previous years, requests for funding for advertising and appropriate promotional materials have been supported by Council, and drawn from the Committees, Boards and Commissions budget. This year a similar expenditure authorization for promotional funding in the amount of \$6,500 is proposed. Sufficient funds are available for this purpose and with Council approval; this funding would again be drawn from the Committees, Boards and Commissions budget.

4.0 CONCLUSION

Environment Week is a national event to raise environmental awareness and encourage environmental stewardship. This year Environment Week occurs on 2009 June 1 to June 7. This report presents, for Committee and Council approval, a summary of proposed events, to be undertaken with our community partners, to celebrate Environment Week in Burnaby for 2009. This year, a broad spectrum of activities, under the theme "Small Change – Big Impact", are proposed for approval for the period of mid-May to mid-June to raise awareness of opportunities to improve our environment.
