#### REPORT

### **Background**

Earlier in 2009, Council received a detailed report discussing the City of Burnaby's Sister Cities and Friendship Cities and advising that the City was selected to receive one time funding of \$50,000 from the Provincial Government to promote further twinning initiatives.

Twinning initiatives enhance the ability of our City to support the multi-faceted economic, educational, tourism and cultural opportunities presented through our friendly relationships in Japan, Taiwan and China.

We, as a city, are very proud of our strong and lengthy history associated with international relationships. For example, Burnaby was one of the first communities in Canada to recognize the economic and cultural opportunities of 'twinning' with Asian cities, and has supported a 'sister city' relationship with Kushiro, Japan since 1965. And more recently, the City of Burnaby has entered into Friendship Agreements with Taichung, Taiwan and Zhongshan and Changshu, Peoples Republic of China.

# **Proposal**

Through a planning strategy, accomplished in partnership with the Burnaby Board of Trade, the City developed a program of initiatives in 2009 to further develop its twinning relationships. In addition to those initiatives, and with Council's approval, I now propose to lead an official delegation of City Councilllors, Board of Education representatives, Board of Trade representatives and City staff to visit the cities of Beijing and Tianjin, P.R. of China for the purpose of joining together in business and friendly relationships. This working visit has a busy itinerary in both cities, encompassing a multitude of strategic meetings. The visit to Tianjin will result in the signing of a Friendship

Agreement (see attached invitation from People's Republic of China, Tianjin Dongli District Government).

In conjunction with this mission, I have been invited as a moderator/guest speaker at the World Economic Forum in Dalian, China. This opportunity will also provide Council delegates with an opportunity to meet with government officials in Dalian to determine the level of interest in pursuing a future relationship between the two cities.

## **Funding**

As mentioned previously in this report, the provincial government provided the City of Burnaby with one-time funding of \$50,000.00 to promote B.C. Asia twinning initiatives. This grant covered the cost of the exchange mission to Taiwan and China in May, 2009 and will partially support the proposed mission to China in September, 2009. Funding from the Sister City budget will be utilized to cover any additional costs over and above funds remaining in the provincial government grant.
