SUBJECT:

SANITARY SEWER UTILITY RATES FOR 2010

PURPOSE: To obtain Council approval for 2010 sanitary sewer rates.

RECOMMENDATION:

1. **THAT** the following bylaws be amended to provide for the fees outlined in Schedule C, effective 2010 January 01:

- a) Burnaby Sewerage System Parcel Tax Bylaw
- b) Burnaby Sewer Charge Bylaw

SUMMARY

This is the annual sanitary sewer utility report which reviews revenues and expenditures of the utility and proposed sanitary sewer rates for 2010.

This report proposes a rate increase of 8.5% for the flat rate sewer parcel tax and sewer use charge, and for metered sewer use charges. The general rate increase is required to provide ongoing funding for sewer maintenance and upgrade program. The proposed rate adjustments will ensure that the sanitary sewer utility continues to be financially self sustaining.

Utility charges are collected separately from property taxes and will be due 2010 March 15. To promote payment by the due date, Burnaby offers a 5% discounted rate for payment on or before March 15.

The Director Engineering concurs with the recommendation in this report.

REPORT

1. INTRODUCTION

All properties in Burnaby with access to sewer paid a flat sewer parcel tax of \$370.85 for single family homes in 2009. In addition to a share of the parcel tax, residential units in multiple dwellings pay a flat annual user fee of \$200.87 in 2009. The sewer parcel tax and the sewer use fee are billed separately from property taxes. The due date for these utility charges in 2010 will be March 15. Large volume users are metered and pay for sewer services based on the volume of water consumption.

2. PROJECTED EXPENDITURES AND REVENUES FOR 2010

Schedule A attached summarizes the expected expenditures and revenues for 2010.

EXPENDITURES

The cost of operating and maintaining the City's sewer system in 2010 is expected to increase by \$1,332,990. The increase in the expenditure budget is necessary to cover increased sewer maintenance requirements, GVS&DD Levy increases, provide for higher costs for aging infrastructure replacement and to ensure that the sanitary sewer utility continues to be self-supporting in future years.

There are a total of 670 km of sewer mains and 250 km of sewer connections installed within the City right-of-way corridors. The City is progressing well with its combined sewer separation program in North Burnaby. In the past few years, the City has been able to take advantage of the infrastructure funding grant from senior governments to facilitate the sewer separation program. Staff will continue to monitor funding opportunities through the Provincial-Federal Building Canada initiative to advance the sewer separation program.

Sewer pump stations are a key component of the sewer collection system in Big Bend and Central Valley. A recent condition and capacity study commissioned by the City has identified several sewer pump stations within the Central Valley area that will require major upgrades to replace existing aging equipment and to meet the population growth.

The proposed GVS&DD Levy is subject to review by the GVRD Board. The review may result in a change in the total sewerage cost to Burnaby from the current projection. Schedule B *attached* summarizes the projected costs of the GVS&DD levy to Burnaby.

REVENUES

It has been Council's objective that the sanitary sewer system be financially self sustaining. This is accomplished on a user pay basis. Sewer charges are reviewed annually and rate changes are recommended to Council.

Sewer rates have increased since 2000 at the following rate.

This report proposes an 8.5% rate increase in all sewer charges for 2010 to offset expenditures changes detailed above. The proposed rates will increase the sewer utility bill for a single family home by \$31.52 from \$370.85 to \$402.37 if payment is made by the due date. Current and proposed 2010 sewer rates are shown in Schedule C *attached*.

A. Contaminated Groundwater Charges

The GVS&DD and the City introduced charges to recover the costs of handling discharges of contaminated water into municipal sewer systems in 1997. The GVS&DD agreed to collect and remit the charges to the city at the time that the GVS&DD issues the discharge permit. The GVS&DD has proposed modest changes to the contaminated ground water charges for 2010. It is recommended that Burnaby implement the proposed changes, as specified below.

B. Industrial Pricing - BOD/TSS Charges

Recognizing that biochemical oxygen demand (BOD) and total suspended solids (TSS) are the main cost drivers of the sewerage and drainage system, the GVS&DD introduced a pricing mechanism that directly quantifies the level of BOD/TSS that is being discharged into the sewerage system by individual industries. Permitted industries will not pay less in BOD/TSS charges than they currently pay towards regional costs. Eight of the twenty-three permitted industries will be charged BOD/TSS charges in 2010. These eight companies will also be responsible for their portion of municipal sewerage costs. The remaining industries not charged BOD/TSS, based on current loadings, will continue to be levied regular metered sewer use

charges.

Schedule D *attached* provides details on the BOD/TSS charges for 2010 as well as each industry's anticipated share of regional and municipal costs. These charges are subject to review and may be modified prior to the New Year.

3. INCENTIVE FOR ON TIME PAYMENT OF FLAT AND METERED RATES

In 1994 Burnaby began collecting utility charges separately from property taxes. Collection of utility charges in mid March provides investment income that serves to decrease the amount of taxes levied. Consequently, separate billing for utilities will continue in 2010.

Burnaby offers a 5% discounted rate for payment on or before the due date. On a single family home the proposed sewer parcel tax for people who pay on or before March 15, 2010 would be \$402.37. The rate for payment after 2010 March 15 would be \$423.55. The discounted rate also applies to sewer use fees. Burnaby charges metered users a discounted rate on payments made within 30 days of the billing date on the metered sewer use bill. The discounted rate for metered users is also 5% less than the non-discounted rate.

4. PUBLIC NOTICE

Once approved by Council a general notice informing all users of the rate increase will be placed in a local newspaper and *InfoBurnaby*. Metered users and permitted industries part of the BOD/TSS program will be notified by letter.

The Director Engineering concurs with the recommendations contained in this report.
