A) Finance & Civic Development Committee
Re: Establishment of a Solid Waste and
Recycling Utility

The Finance & Civic Development Committee submitted a report requesting approval for the establishment of a solid waste and recycling utility to create a self-sustaining user pay system for solid waste and recycling management.

The Director Engineering L. Chu and Director Finance R. Earle appeared before Council to present an overview of current Council initiatives on waste reduction. Mr. Chu reviewed the automated collection program for 2009 designed to increase waste reduction, reduce costs and improve efficiency and the workers' health and safety. The target for implementation is 2009 October.

Waste collection containers would range in size from 120 litres to 360 litres with collection costs for each household ranging from \$140 per year for the 120 litre size to \$250 per year for the larger 360 litre size. Green waste and recycling would cost \$40 per year per household. Multifamily units would incur a volume based rate of \$6 to \$46 depending on the size of the container and \$20 per year for green waste and recycling. The system is designed to be revenue neutral.

The Finance & Civic Development Committee recommended:

1. THAT Council approve the City's solid waste and recycling services be transferred from the general property tax base to the utility tax base and that

the proposed user rates as outlined in Table 2 in this report be approved for implementation in 2010.

2. THAT staff be authorized to amend the existing Solid Waste Bylaw to reflect the upcoming automated collection program and the recommended utility fee schedule as outlined in this report.
