BAAC has played a very important role since its establishment twenty-one years ago in providing valuable advice and recommendations to the City regarding accessibility issues. Implementation of items identified in the workplan for 2009 will allow BAAC to continue to assist the City of meet its commitment to enhancing access to facilities and services for Burnaby residents with disabilities. Access Awareness Day will take place in 2009 June.

D) Social Issues Committee Re: Hospital Employees' Union – Living Wage Campaign

The Social Issues Committee submitted a report providing Council with information on the Hospital Employees' Union's Living Wage Campaign. Since the Provincial government initiated its Core Service Review in early 2002, Council has expressed its concerns regarding a number of policy changes that have negatively impacted vulnerable individuals and families. Since the legislation was passed, hospital employee wages have been reduced to their current hourly rate of \$13.05. The Campaign calls on health authorities to require their contractors to pay a *"living wage"* to its employees (recently identified as \$16.74 an hour in Metro Vancouver for each parent working full-time with two young children).

The Social Issues Committee recommended:

- 1. THAT Council convey its concerns to the Minister of Health Services regarding the negative impacts associated with the wage reductions for housekeeping and dietary workers in B.C. hospitals that have occurred since the Province passed the Health and Social Services Delivery Improvement Act in 2002.
- 2. THAT a copy of this report be sent to the Hospital Employees' Union, 5000 North Fraser Way, Burnaby, B.C. V5J 5M3.

"...more needs to be done to ensure that provincial tax relief is not negated by local property tax hikes. Our government will work with the Union of British Columbia Municipalities to develop new legislation over the summer, for introduction early next year, that will protect provincial tax reductions"; and

WHEREAS the Throne Speech goes on to say that "All levels of government must be equally disciplined to ensure that tax reductions at one level of government are not negated by tax increases at another"; and

WHEREAS this proposed action is another in a long series of actions by the Provincial Government that interfere in the autonomy of local governments without acknowledging the restrictions already placed on our level of government, such as not being allowed to operate at a deficit; or recognizing the impact of the off-loading of the cost of services from the other levels of government;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Burnaby Council go on record as strongly opposing any further fiscal restrictions on our local government authority, and that we request through a resolution to the LMLGA that the UBCM advise the Provincial Government that they will not 'work with' the government towards any such legislation, and further;

THAT Burnaby Council request, through the LMLGA that the UBCM develop a comprehensive campaign showing the impact to property tax payers of senior government off-loading, and defending the accomplishments of cities who deliver a wealth of services for only 8 cents of each tax dollar."
